RESOLVE, in favor of the Raymond Fish Hatchery, Cumber-
land County, Maine.

Resolved, That the sum of one thousand dollars be and is
2 hereby appropriated for the year nineteen hundred and fif-
3 teen, to be expended by the Commissioners of Inland Fish-
4 eries and Game, under the direction of the Governor and
5 Council, for repairs and additions to the State fish hatchery
6 at Raymond, Cumberland County, Maine.

STATEMENT OF FACTS.

The Raymond Fish Hatchery at Raymond, Maine, is inadequately equipped to economically make return on the money invested and expended by the State, due to the lack of cold water and lack of sufficient feeding pools. The State has already expended a large sum of money in a twelve-inch pipe line from the waters of Panther pond to the Hatchery troughs, which is inadequate in that it takes only surface water. The Hatchery can only be made efficient by rearing the fish to one and two years old stages in additional feeding pools and by a supply of cold water.

ADDITIONAL STATEMENT BY COMMITTEE.

After considering the matter the Committee on Inland Fisheries and Game decided to recommend the appropriation of the within amount, which will enable the Commissioners to extend the present pipe line into a sufficient depth of water to insure a water supply of the proper temperature and make some necessary repairs.
