## IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE HUNDRED AND FIFTEEN

AN ACT to amend Section 9 of Chapter 53 of the Laws of 1913, "An Act for the better regulation of the practice of Dentistry."

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Section 9 of Chapter 53 of the Laws of 1913 is

- 2 amended by inserting and adding after the ninth line
- 3 the following: "Or provided that said applicant was in prac-
- 4 tice in good standing in another State at the time said Chap-
- 5 ter 53 of the Laws of 1913 was enacted and that his profes-
- 6 sional education was equal to that required in this State just
- 7 prior to the enactment of said Chapter 53.' So that said Sec-
- 8 tion as amended shall read as follows:

'Sect. 9. The Board may at its discretion without the exam-10 ination as hereinabove provided, issue its certificate to any 11 applicant therefor who shall furnish proof, satisfactory to 12 said Board that he has been duly licensed to practice Den-13 tistry in another State after full compliance with the require-14 ments of its dental laws; provided, however, that his pro-15 fessional education shall not be less than that required in 16 this State, and provided also that such applicant shall have 17 been at least five years in actual practice in the State in 18 which said license was granted. Or, provided that said ap-19 plicant was in good standing in another State at the time 20 Chapter 53 of the Laws of 1913 was enacted and that his 21 professional education was equal to that required in this 22 State just prior to the enactment to said Chapter 53. Every 23 certificate so given shall state on its face the grounds upon 24 which it is granted and the applicant may be required to fur-25 nish proof upon affidavit. The fee for such a certificate 26 shall be Twenty Dollars.
