STATE OF MAINE

RESOLVE, in favor of Saint Joseph's Academy, Portland, to assist in the payment of the debt and for permanent improvements, and equipment.

Resolved, That there be and hereby is appropriated in
2 favor of Saint Joseph's Academy in Portland the sum of
3 one thousand five hundred dollars for the year nineteen
4 hundred and fifteen and the sum of one thousand five hun-
5 dred dollars for the year nineteen hundred and sixteen, such
6 amounts to be used to assist in the payment of the debt of
7 said Academy and for permanent improvements and equip-
8 ment.

STATEMENT OF FACTS.

Saint Joseph's Academy is an institution for the secondary education of young women located in Portland. It occupies a new and substantial building upon which a large indebtedness remains. This building is still incomplete and requires additional funds for making it suitably adapted to the work of the institution. The accompanying resolve asks for an appropriation to assist in discharging the indebtedness of the institution and in making permanent improvements and equipment on the Academy building.
