AN ACT relating to salaries of subordinate officers of the  
Senate.

---

*Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:*

Section. 1. The secretary of the Senate shall perform the  
2 usual duties of the office during the session of the Legisla-  
3 ture, file and index all papers, which has been subject to  
4 adverse legislative action, index and supervise the publica-  
5 tion of the senate journal, and in addition thereto devote  
6 the month of December of the year following the legislative  
7 session to the work of making preparation for the incoming  
8 legislature. He shall also perform the duties required of  
9 him by section twenty-seven and thirty of chapter two of  
10 the revised Statutes.

He shall receive a salary of fifteen hundred dollars in full  
12 for all official services by him performed during the term  
13 for which he is chosen, as follows: eleven hundred dollars  
14 at the end of the session of the legislature, three hundred  
15 dollars when journal of Senate is completed and one hun-  
16 dred dollars when index of papers is completed.

Sect. 2. The assistant secretary of the senate shall receive  
2 a salary of six hundred dollars. His work shall be per-  
3 formed under the direction of the secretary.

Sect. 3. The messenger of the senate shall receive a sal-  
2 ary of four hundred dollars.

Sect. 4. The assistant messenger, folder, assistant folder,  
2 postmaster and doorkeeper shall each receive a salary of  
3 three hundred dollars.

Sect. 5. The pages shall each receive a salary of one hun-  
2 dred and fifty dollars.

Sect. 6. The official reporter shall receive a salary of one  
2 thousand dollars.

Sect. 7. All of the above officers shall work under the di-  
2 rection of the president of the senate.

The above salaries shall be in full for all official services  
4 by them performed during the term for which they are  
5 chosen and no other or further compensation shall be al-  
6 lowed them, except in case of an adjourned or special ses-  
7 sion of the legislature.
