STATE OF MAINE

RESOLVE in favor of the town of Otisfield.

Resolved, That there be and hereby is appropriated the

- 2 sum of Fifty-Three Dollars and Forty Cents, and that the
- 3 same be paid to the town of Otisfield for the purpose of re-
- 4 imbursing said town for money paid out on account of
- 5 Emma Bresette, an alien and State pauper.



STATEMENT OF FACTS.

Emma Bresette, a native of Canada, was exposed to small-pox in that place and was to be quarantined there. Just before the quarantine was placed upon the place where she was located she left that place and came into the state of Maine. Before the fact of her exposure to the disease became known she secured a place in a family in the town of Otisfield. Shortly afterward the town officers learned of her exposure to the disease, and the town was compelled to pay out the sum called for in this resolve for the purpose of placing a quarantine upon the house where she was located, and also for having the residents of that locality vaccinated.
