STATE OF MAINE

RESOLVE in favor of the Town of Orneville in the County
of Piscataquis.

Resolved, That there be and hereby is appropriated the
2 sum of twenty dollars and eighty-six cents (\$20.86) to be
3 paid to the Town of Orneville in the County of Piscata-
4 quis to reimburse said town for its expenses in committing
5 one John W. Conley, a state pauper, to the Bangor State
6 Hospital on September 21st, A. D. 1914.

STATEMENT OF FACTS.

On September 21st, 1914, John W. Conley was found to be insane after a hearing by virtue of the Revised Statutes in such case provided, and he was committed to the Bangor State Hospital from the Town of Orneville at the expense of said town in the sum of twenty dollars and eighty-six cents (\$20.86). The said John W. Conley has no pauper settlement in said Town of Orneville, and after a careful investigation by the selectmen of said town they are unable to learn that he has one in the state. He is alleged to be an alien by the overseers of the poor of the Town of Abbot in said county where he formerly resided, and from all investigation they have made the selectmen of said Orneville believe the said Conley to have no pauper settlement in the state, and that the aforesaid charges should be borne by the state and not by this town, where he has no legal settlement.
