STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE HUNDRED AND FIFTEEN

AN ACT additional to chapter thirty-two of the Revised Statutes, as amended by chapter two hundred and six of the public laws of nineteen hundred and thirteen, relating to fishing in Ellis Pond, in Somerset County.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

No person shall fish for, take, catch or kill any kind of

- 2 fish at any time during the month of September of each
- 3 year in that part of Ellis pond lying southerly of the boat
- 4 landing on the west side of said pond and southerly of the
- 5 first point above the outlet on the east side of said pond,
- 6 which pond is situated in the west part of Township Num-

- 7 ber One, Range Six, B. K. P., W. R. K., known as the Ter.
- 8 Thousand Acre Tract, in Somerset county.

No person shall have in possession at any time any kinc. 10 of fish taken in violation of any provision of this act.

Whoever violates any provision of this act shall pay a fine 12 of not less than ten dollars nor more than thirty dollars and 13 costs for each offense; and in addition thereto one dollar 14 for each fish taken, caught, killed or had in possession in 15 violation of any provision of this act.
