STATE OF MAINE

AN ACT establishing a Close Time on Lobsters, in the Towns of Cutler, Trescott and Lubec, Washington County.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Section 1. No person shall take, catch, kill or destroy any 2 lobsters between the first day of July and the fifteenth day 3 of September in each year in any of the waters in the 4 Towns of Cutler, Trescott and Lubec in Washington County, and no person within the following points commencing 6 at township rock in said town of Cutler running south 7 southwest, two and three-fourths miles hence south south-8 east, one half mile hence south by west three fourths west, 9 to the three-mile limit hence running along the three-mile 10 limit to a point three miles southeast from West Quoddy 11 Head, shall set a trap within said waters for the purpose of

12 taking, catching, or destroying any lobsters between said 13 dates under a penalty of five dollars for each lobster 14 trapped.

Sect. 2. All fines and penalties provided for by this Act 2 may be recovered as provided by Section 48 of Chapter 3 285 of the Public Laws of 1897.
