STATE OF MAINE

RESOLVE in favor of E. W. Murphy, Secretary of the Joint Special Committee appointed by the 76th Legislature on Women's Reformatory, State School for Boys and Industrial School for Girls.

Resolved, That there be and hereby is appropriated to E. W. Murphy the sum of Three Hundred and Four Dollars and ninety-four cents for expense incurred by the Committee in investigating in relation to the proposed Woman's Reformatory and additional buildings at the State School for Boys and Industrial School for Girls.

STATEMENT OF FACTS.

The expense incurred by the committee in the prosecution of its work consisted principally of the personal traveling and hotel expenses of the members. Postage, notice for hearings in the newspapers, Senators Allen and Murphy acting as a sub-Committee from the Committee visited various institutions in New York State and Massachusetts.
