Senate Amendment "A" to Senate Document Number 429.

Senate Document Number 429 is hereby amended by 2 adding thereto the following section:

'Sect. 4. This resolve shall be void and of no effect unless 4 the towns through which the proposed road passes shall 5 undertake that all road materials, including clay, gravel, 6 sand and rock necessary for the improvement contemplated 7 by this resolve shall be furnished without expense to the 8 state and that said towns shall assume and pay all damages 9 whatsoever arising from 'the taking of land or from the 10 change of grade, drainage or alignment deemed by the state

11 highway commission as necessary for said improvement, 12 and in so far as said road passes through unorganized town-13 ships, the proprietors of said townships shall undertake on 14 their behalf the duties and obligations hereby imposed upon 15 said towns and shall also include in materials furnished by 16 them such lumber as is necessary for use in bridge con-17 struction. Said way when so improved shall be thereafter 18 continually maintained under the direction and control of 19 said commission at the joint expense of state, towns through 20 which it passes and the proprietors of the unorganized 21 townships through which it passes. The charge against said 22 towns and said proprietors for maintenance of said way 23 shall not exceed fifty per cent of the actual cost of such 24 maintenance nor an average of more than thirty dollars per 25 mile per annum. The payment by said towns of their share 26 of said maintenance shall be enforced in the manner pro-27 vided in Sections ten and twenty-five of Chapter 130 of the 28 Public Laws of 1913 and the payment by said proprietors 29 of said unorganized townships shall be enforced by adding 30 such payment to their county tax and the county commis-31 sioners of Somerset County are hereby given authority to 32 assess and collect said tax in the same manner in which 33 their county taxes are collected. The share of the state in 34 said maintenance shall be paid out of the fund for adminis-35 tration and maintenance created by virtue of Section 33 of . 36 Chapter 130 of the Public Laws of 1913.
