## STATE OF MAINE

### IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE HUNDRED AND FIFTEEN

ORDER, for investigation of Railroads by Special Joint Committee of the Legislature.

Ordered, the Senate concurring, that a special joint com-2 mittee of two on that part of the Senate and three on the 3 part of the House, be appointed to inquire into tariff rates, 4 rules of regulation of Maine Central Railroad Company: to 5 investigate the capitalization of said company and ascertain 6 when, to whom, and for what purposes its stocks and bonds 7 have been issued and what properties or other values it has 8 received for the same: ascertain the cause of the deprecia-9 tion of the value of its capital stock; what, if any, of its 10 properties are unprofitable and whether or not the same

11 should be disposed of; whether there has been any violation 12 of law in the acquisition of its properties, and if so what 13 persons or corporations, if any, are under legal liability to 14 make restitution; to investigate the management of said 15 company and its subsidiary companies and outside proper-16 ties, including the amounts paid since January 1st, 1900 as 17 salaries to its officers, attorney fees, and for the purpose of 18 influencing legislation; also investigate its past and present 19 relations and financial transactions with the Boston & Maine 20 Railroad Company and its dealings with bankers and brok-21 ers in the flotation of its stock and securities; that said com-22 mittee shall report the evidence together with its findings of 23 fact and recommendations.

For the purposes aforesaid said committee is authorized to 25 employ counsel and such experts as they may deem neces-26 sary, and a stenographer, and to compel the attendance of 27 witnesses, at the expense of the State, to appear before them 28 and give evidence and produce books, papers, and other doc-29 uments pertinent to the subject matter of their inquiry. 30 Said committee is empowered to sit in vacation of the Legis-31 lature, and shall begin its investigation within thirty days 32 after the adjournment of the Legislature, and conclude the 33 same as soon as reasonably practicable.

Said committee shall file its report with the Governor and 35 Council as soon as may be, and the Governor and Council 36 shall forthwith cause to be printed two thousand copies 37 thereof for use of the State.

### SENATE-No. 449

The members of said committee shall receive five dollars a 39 day for each day devoted to this investigation and prepara-40 tion of their report, and actual expenses.

This investigation shall not include the physical valuation 42 of the property of said company.
