AN ACT Relative to the Hours of Labor of Conductors and  
Motormen.

---

*Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:*

No street railway company, and no person, firm, corporation or other employer operating a street railway, shall require any conductor or motorman, to work more than nine hours in any day; and if any such conductor or motorman shall work nine hours or less in any day, such work shall be performed within eleven consecutive hours.
