IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE
HUNDRED AND SEVENTEEN

RESOLVE, in Favor of Cutting Down Bonney Hill, in the
Town of Princeton, and Building Road Around Taylor Hill,
in the Town of Alexander, Adjoining.

Resolved, That there be and hereby is appropriated the
2 *sum of two thousand four hundred dollars (\$2,400.00) in*
3 *the year 1917 and two thousand four hundred dollars (\$2,-*
4 *400.00) in the year 1918, for the purpose of improving a*
5 *combination trunk line and market road in the towns of*
6 *Princeton and Alexander, in Washington county, providing*
7 *that the towns of Princeton and Alexander each at their*

8 next annual town meeting raise the sum of four hundred
9 dollars (\$400.00) for said purpose, same to be expended
10 under the supervision of the state highway commission.

STATEMENT OF FACTS.

Bonney Hill, in Princeton, is especially steep with a sixteen per cent grade for a portion of the distance; Taylor Hill, in Alexander, adjoining, is a heavy grade which can be overcome by re-locating road around. These hills are on the most direct line from Machias to Princeton.
