STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE HUNDRED AND SEVENTEEN

AN ACT to regulate the use of motor vehicles.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Section 1. Every person operating a motor vehicle upon 2 one of the highways in this state when approaching or pass-3 ing a car of a street railway which has been stopped to allow 4 passengers to alight or embark, shall bring said vehicle to a 5 full stop; and upon approaching any street car, team or 6 vehicle, in the well-lighted parts of the streets of a city or 7 town, every operator of a motor vehicle shall dim or shut off 8 the headlights of his car or vehicle until such street car, 9 team or vehicle is passed.

Sect. 2. Every person operating a motor vehicle upon any 2 of the highways in this state when approaching a pedestrian 3 who is upon the travelled part of any way and not upon a 4 sidewalk, or when approaching a curve, an intersection of 5 two or more streets, or a portion of the way where a clear 6 view is obstructed, shall drive his motor vehicle at a slow 7 rate of speed and give a timely signal with his bell, horn or 8 other device for signalling, provided that in the thickly 9 settled parts of a city or town no bell, horn or other device 10 for signalling shall be sounded so as to make a harsh, 11 objectionable or unreasonable noise.

Sect. 3. Every person operating a motor vehicle shall 2 bring the vehicle and motor propelling it to a full stop when 3 approaching the track of a steam railroad at grade crossings, 4 and shall remain stationary so long as may be reasonable to 5 ascertain the approach of a train; provided that none of the 6 provisions of this act shall apply to vehicles of the fire 7 department or police department of any municipality, nor to 8 ambulances.

Sect. 4. Any violations of the preceding sections shall be 2 punished by a fine of not less than twenty nor more than 3 fifty dollars, or by imprisonment of not less than thirty nor 4 more than sixty days or by both such fine and imprisonment.
