STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE
HUNDRED AND SEVENTEEN

RESOLVE, in favor of improvement of the Navigation of the
Fish River Lakes in the County of Aroostook.

Resolved, that the sum of three thousand dollars be appropriated to improve the navigation of the thoroughfares between Eagle Lake and Long Lake on the Fish River Waters in the County of Aroostook.

STATEMENT OF FACTS.

The thoroughfares between these lakes are shoal, and with this appropriation would so improve the navigation of these lakes that boats could be run for a distance of twenty-five miles and be of great benefit to the people in that section of the state.

Hundreds and hundreds of visitors come to that section of the state every summer from Boston, New York, and many other parts of the country, thus bringing a large amount of money into the state. If these waters could be fixed so that larger boats could be put in, it would attract many more to visit that section.
