STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE HUNDRED AND SEVENTEEN

AN ACT to amend section one of chapter one hundred fortyone of the Revised Statutes relating to the appointment of Medical Examiners.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows: Section one of chapter one hundred forty-one of the Re-2 vised Statutes is hereby amended by striking out the word
3 "Cumberland" in the ninth line thereof, and inserting after
4 the word "each" in the tenth line, the words 'and for the
5 county of Cumberland five,' so that said section as amended,
6 shall read as follows:

HOUSE-No. 87.

'Section 1. The governor, with the advice and consent 2 of the council, shall appoint for a term of four years, medi-3 cal examiners for each county in the state, who shall be 4 able and discreet men, learned in the science of medicine 5 and anatomy, and bona fide residents of the county for which 6 they are appointed. The number of medical examiners so 7 to be appointed shall be as follows: For the counties of 8 Knox, Lincoln, Sagadahoc and Waldo, one each; for the 9 counties of Androscoggin, Frankiln, Hancock, Oxford, Pis-10 cataguis, Somerset and Washington, two each; for the coun-II ties of Aroostook, Kennebec, Penobscot and York, three 12 each, and for the county of Cumberland five; and they shall 13 be appointed with reference to territorial distribution. They 14 shall be liable to removal from office by the governor and 15 council at any time, for cause. Each medical examiner be-16 fore entering upon the duties of his office, shall be duly 17 sworn to the faithful performance of his duty. They shall 18 make examination as hereinafter provided upon the view 10 of the dead bodies of such persons only as are supposed to 20 have come to their death by violence or unlawful act.'
