STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE HUNDRED AND SEVENTEEN

RESOLVE reimbursing the State Legislative Printer for Overtime Work.

Resolved, That there be, and hereby is, appropriated the 2 sum of two hundred nine dollars forty-two cents, with in-3 terest thereon at the rate of six per cent per annum from 4 June 9, 1915, for the purpose of reimbursing the Kennebec 5 Journal Company for overtime work performed pursuant 6 to its contract with the state, and at the request of the proper 7 authorities of the Seventy-seventh Legislature.



STATEMENT OF FACTS ACCOMPANYING "RESOLVE REIMBURSING THE STATE LEGISLATIVE PRINTER FOR OVERTIME WORK."

The Kennebec Journal Company, under its contract with the state for legislative printing, performed overtime work to the amount of two hundred nine dollars forty-two cents (\$209.42) during the Seventy-seventh Legislative Session. For this it has never received payment, though it seasonably presented its bill for same, and on June 9, 1915, formally requested payment.

The work in question was ordered by the Legislature as overtime work, with the expectation that it would be performed as such, and was completed by the Kennebec Journal Company pursuant to its contract. As a matter of fact, to complete this work at the time ordered, the printers were obliged to work on Sunday and at other times for which they were obliged to pay their workmen price and a half.
