STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE
HUNDRED AND SEVENTEEN

RESOLVE in Favor of Rachel Stanley.

Resolved, That there be and hereby is appropriated three
2 hundred dollars per annum for the years nineteen hundred
3 and seventeen and nineteen hundred and eighteen, the said
4 money to be paid Rachel Stanley of Paris in quarterly pay-
5 ments of seventy-five dollars each, under the supervision of
6 the governor and council.

STATEMENT OF FACTS.

Rachel Stanley, now of Paris, but formerly of Auburn, is the widow of John F. Stanley, who died on November 23, 1916, from injuries received from an attack of a mad deer which occurred on November 20th. Mr. Stanley had been the Superintendent of the Lake Auburn Fish Hatchery for about twenty years. The manner and cause of his death was so well advertised in the papers that it need not be repeated. Rachel Stanley, his widow, is sixty-six years of age. She was badly injured herself in trying to rescue her husband and for a long time required the assistance of a trained nurse. She has been and is now a great sufferer and some of her injuries seem to be permanent, especially injuries to her joints. Her husband left no property whatever and she is entirely dependent upon the charity of her people.
