STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE HUNDRED AND SEVENTEEN

AN ACT to amend Paragraph 5, Section 64 of Chapter 86 of the Revised Statutes relating to exemptions from attachment.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Paragraph 5 of Section 64. Chapter 86, Revised Statutes,

- 2 is hereby amended by inserting after the words, "all produce
- 3 of farms," in the first line, the words, "grown on not ex-
- 4 ceeding two acres of land and all hay," and after the words.
- 5 "until harvested" in said first line, the words, 'if he has
- 6 produce growing on more than two acres, he may elect
- 7 which two acres shall be exempt,' so that said Section as
- 8 amended shall read as follows:

'All produce of farms grown on not exceeding two acres 2 of land, and all hay until harvested; if he has produce grow-3 ing on more than two acres, he may elect which two acres 4 shall be exempt; one barrel of flour; corn and grain necessary for himself and family, not exceeding thirty bushels; 6 all potatoes and other provisions raised or bought, and 7 necessary for himself and family; and all flax raised on a 8 half acre of land, and all articles manufactured therefrom 9 for the use of himself and family.'
