STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE
HUNDRED AND SEVENTEEN

AN ACT to specify the times when County Commissioners
shall receive their Salaries.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Section forty-two of chapter one hundred seventeen of
2 the Revised Statutes is hereby amended by striking out the
3 words "in quarterly payments on the first days of January,
4 April, July and October," in the third and fourth lines of
5 the first paragraph thereof and inserting in place thereof,
6 'in monthly payments on the first day of each month for
7 the preceding month,' so that said paragraph as amended
8 shall read as follows:

Each county commissioner in the several counties shall
2 receive an annual salary from the county treasury in
3 monthly payments on the first day of each month for the
4 preceding month, as follows:

Androscoggin, seven hundred and fifty dollars.

Aroostook, eleven hundred dollars.

Cumberland, twelve hundred and fifty dollars.

Franklin, four hundred and fifty dollars.

Hancock, seven hundred and fifty dollars.

Kennebec, one thousand dollars.

Knox, four hundred dollars.

Lincoln, three hundred dollars.

Oxford, six hundred dollars.

Penobscot, twelve hundred dollars.

Piscataquis, five hundred dollars.

Sagadahoc, four hundred dollars.

Somerset, six hundred and fifty dollars.

Waldo, four hundred dollars.

Washington, six hundred and fifty dollars.

York, eight hundred and fifty dollars.
