STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE HUNDRED AND SEVENTEEN

AN ACT to amend the Charter of the City of Hallowell. Whereas it is necessary for the several questions, submitted to be voted upon by the provisions of this acr, to be so submitted at the regular annual election to be held in the City of Hallowell on the first Monday of March, nineteen hundred seventeen, in order to render this act effective; and whereas, in the judgment of the Legislature, these facts render the passage of this act immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health and safety and constitute an emergency within the meaning of the constitution; now therefore,

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Section 1. The municipal election for the choice of 2 mayor, aldermen, city constables, and such other officers as 3 may hereafter be elected at large, of the city of Hallowell, 4 and of wardens and ward clerks of the several wards in 5 said city, shall be held on the second Monday of December, 6 annually, beginning with the year nineteen hundred seven-7 teen, instead of on the first Monday of March. Said of-8 ficers chosen at any annual election and all subordinate **9** officers or agents for the city now elected or appointed for 10 a term of one year (not including the city marshal and 11 street commissioner) shall hold their offices one year from 12 the first Monday of January next following said election, 13 and until others shall be elected or appointed and qualified 14 in their places, subject to removal as now provided by the 15 charter and ordinances of said city; except that those that 16 shall be chosen at the election to be held on the first Monday 17 of March in the year nineteen hundred seventeen and said 18 subordinate officers or agents shall hold their offices from 19 the second Monday of March in the year nineteen hundred 20 seventeen until the first Monday of January in the year 21 nineteen hundred eighteen, and until their successors are 22 elected or appointed and qualified in their places; provided, 23 however, that if section two of this act shall be accepted, 24 as hereinafter provided, by the electors of said city, then 25 the municipal election shall be held biennially, instead of an-26 nually, beginning with the second Monday of December in 27 the year nineteen hundred seventeen, and the aforesaid of-28 ficers chosen at any biennial election and said subordinate 29 officers or agents shall hold their offices two years from the 30 first Monday of January next following said biennial elec-31 tion, and until their successors are elected or appointed and 32 qualified in their places, subject to removal as aforesaid; ex-33 cept that those that shall be chosen at the election to be held 34 on the first Monday of March in the year nineteen hundred 35 seventeen and said subordinate officers or agents shall hold 36 their offices from the second Monday of March in the year 37 nineteen hundred seventeen until the first Monday of Jan-38 uary in the year nineteen hundred eighteen, and until their 39 successors are elected or appointed and qualified in their 40 places.

Sect. 2. The municipal election for the choice of mayor, 2 aldermen, city constables, and such other officers as may 3 hereafter be elected at large, of the city of Hallowell, and 4 of wardens and ward clerks of the several wards in said 5 city, shall be held once in two years instead of annually, and 6 all subordinate officers or agents for the city, now elected 7 or appointed for a term of one year (not including the city 8 marshal and street commissioner) shall be elected or ap-9 pointed, in the manner now provided therefor, and all 10 vacancies in such offices filled for a term of two years and 11 until others shall be elected or appointed and qualified in 12 their places; anything in the charter or ordinances of said 13 city of Hallowell to the contrary notwithstanding, but said 14 subordinate officers or agents shall be subject to removal as 15 now provided by said charter and ordinances. If section 16 one of this act shall be accepted by the electors of said city, 17 the officers chosen at the municipal election to be held on 18 the first Monday of March in the year nineteen hundred 19 seventeen and all said subordinate officers or agents shall 20 hold their offices from the Monday following said municipal 21 election until the first Monday of January in the year nine-22 teen hundred eighteen and until their successors are elected 23 or appointed and qualified in their places, and thereafter 24 the municipal election shall be held on the second Monday 25 of December biennially, beginning with the second Monday 26 of December in the year nineteen hundred seventeen, and 27 the officers chosen at any biennial December election and all 28 said subordinate officers or agents shall hold their offices 29 two years from the first Monday of January following said 30 municipal election and until their successors are elected or 31 appointed and qualified in their places, subject to removal 32 as aforesaid. If said section one shall not be accepted by 33 the electors of said city, then the municipal election shall be 34 held on the first Monday of March in the year nineteen hun-35 dred seventeen and biennially thereafter on the first Mor 36 day of March, and the officers chosen at any biennial March 37 election beginning with the March Municipal election in the 38 year nineteen hundred seventeen, which in such case is 39 deemed the first biennial election, and all said subordinate 40 officers or agents shall hold their offices two years from the 41 Monday following said first biennial election, and until their 42 successors are elected or appointed and qualified in their 43 places, subject to removal as aforesaid.

Sect. 3. The city marshal and the street commissioner 2 for said city shall be appointed by the mayor and such ap-3 pointments shall be made and take effect as soon as con-4 venient after the beginning of the mayor's term of office, not 5 exceeding a period of one month, and said officers shall 6 hold their respective offices during the term for which the 7 mayor was elected, and until others are respectively ap-8 pointed and qualified in their places, subject to removal 9 by the mayor at his pleasure; and the mayor shall have 10 and exercise the same power of appointment to fill any 11 vacancy from any cause in either of said offices, but any 12 person so appointed to fill a vacancy from any cause other 13 than expiration of the term of office, shall hold said office 14 during the unexpired term of his predecessor, subject to 15 removal by the mayor at his pleasure.

Provided, however, that the city marshal and street com-2 missioner elected at the municipal election to be held on 3 the first Monday of March in the year nineteen hundred 4 seventeen shall hold their respective offices as follows: 5 if section one of this act shall be accepted by the electors 6 of said city, then as therein provided; otherwise, from the 7 Monday following said election to the Monday following the 8 next annual or biennial municipal election held for the elec-9 tion of the officers enumerated in sections one and two of

10 this act, and until others are appointed and qualified in their 11 places.

Sect. 4. Sections one, two, and three of this act shall 2 take effect only when accepted, as hereinafter provided, by 3 the electors of said city qualified to vote in a municipal 4 election. Said sections shall be submitted to be voted upon 5 by the qualified electors of said city at the regular annual 6 election to be held on the first Monday of March, nineteen 7 hundred seventeen. Said election shall be called, advertised 8 and conducted according to the law relating to municipal 9 elections in said city. The ballots to be used in said election 10 shall be in such form as to permit each of said first three 11 sections of this act to be voted on separately by an expres-12 sion of the voter's opinion on the following three questions 13 relating respectively to said first three sections of this act:

I. Shall the municipal elections, in the city of Hallowell 2 for the election of mayor, aldermen, constables, other of-3 ficers at large and ward officers henceforth be held on the 4 second Monday of December in order that the municipal 5 year may begin on the first Monday of January?

II. Shall the mayor, aldermen, constables, other officers2 at large and ward officers, be elected and subordinate of-3 ficers and agents be elected or appointed, biennially to hold4 office for the term of two years?

III. Shall the city marshal and street commissioner be2 appointed by the mayor, to serve through the mayor's term3 of office, subject to removal by the mayor at his pleasure?

Opposite and to the right of each of said questions shall 2 be printed the two words "Yes" and "No" with the usual 3 squares in which the voter is to mark in the manner re-4 quired by law to express his opinion. Other brief and suit-5 able explanation of the subject matter submitted may be 6 printed on the ballots which in other respects shall conform 7 with all the requirements of law. Such of the sections so 8 submitted as shall receive more affirmative than negative 9 votes at said election shall be deemed to have been ac-10 cepted and shall thereupon be in full force and effect. The 11 result of said election shall be declared by the mayor and 12 aldermen, and due certificate thereof filed with the city 13 clerk and with the secretary of state. A printed copy of 14 the full text of the first four sections of this act shall be 15 posted with each notice of said election, and two copies 16 shall be kept posted in each voting place in said city during 17 said election.

Sect. 5. Section 3 of Chapter 413 of the Private and 2 Special Laws of 1850, entitled, An Act to Incorporate the 3 City of Hallowell, as amended by Chapter 31 of the Private 4 and Special Laws of 1899, is hereby amended by striking 5 out all of said section after the word "vote" in the four-6 teenth line thereof and by adding the words, 'He shall re-7 ceive from the city no compensation other than his salary 8 for any service by him rendered in any other capacity or 9 agency"; so that said section as amended shall read as fol-10 lows:

'Sect. 3. The mayor of said city shall be the chief execu-2 tive officer thereof. It shall be his duty to be vigilant and 3 active in causing the laws and regulations of the city to 4 be executed and enforced, to exercise a general supervision 5 over the conduct of all subordinate officers, and to cause 6 their violations or neglect of duty to be punished. He may 7 call special meetings of the board of aldermen, when in his 8 opinion the interests of the city require it, by a notice in 9 one or more of the papers printed in this city, or by causing 10 a summons or notification to be given in hand or left at the 11 usual dwelling place of each member of the board. He shall 12 from time to time, communicate such information, and 13 recommend such measures as the business and interests of 14 the city may in his opinion require. He shall preside in the 15 board of aldermen, but shall have only a casting vote. He 16 shall receive from the city no compensation other than his 17 salary for any service by him rendered in any other capacity 18 or agency.'

Sect. 6. Section 4 of said Chapter 413 of the Private and 2 Special Laws of 1850, as amended by Chapter 148 of the 3 Private and Special Laws of 1887, and by Chapter 31 of the 4 Private and Special Laws of 1899, is hereby amended by 5 striking out the word "fifty" in the thirty-fourth line thereof 6 and inserting the words 'five hundred' in place thereof; so 7 that said section as amended shall read as follows:

'Sect. 4. The executive powers of said city generally, 2 and the administration of police, with all the powers of the

3 selectmen of the town of Hallowell, shall be vested in the 4 mayor and aldermen as fully as if the same had been herein 5 particularly enumerated; all other powers now vested in 6 the inhabitants of said town, and all powers now vested in 7 the inhabitants of said town, and all powers granted by this 8 Act shall be vested in the mayor and aldermen. The city 9 city council shall annually, on the second Monday of March, 10 or as soon thereafter as conveniently may be, elect and II appoint all the subordinate officers and agents for the city, 12 except city marshal and street commissioner, for the en-13 suing year, including a chief engineer and other engineers 14 of the fire department, which chief engineer, or in his 15 absence any other engineers shall have all power and 16 authority that fire wards now have; shall define their duties 17 and fix their compensation, in cases where such duties and 18 compensation shall not be defined and fixed by the laws of 19 this state; and may remove any officer when in their opinion 20 sufficient cause for their removal exists. All officers shall be 21 chosen and vacancies supplied for the current year, except 22 as hereinafter otherwise directed. All subordinate officers 23 and agents shall hold their offices during the ensuing year 24 and until others shall be elected and qualified in their stead, 25 unless sooner removed by the city council. All moneys 26 received and collected for and on account of the city, by 27 any officer or agent thereof, shall forthwith be paid into the 28 city treasury. The city council shall take care that no 29 moneys shall be paid from the treasury unless granted or

30 appropriated; shall secure a prompt and just accountability 31 by requiring bonds with sufficient penalty and sureties from 32 all persons trusted with the receipt, custody and disburse-33 ment of moneys; shall have the care and superintendence 34 of city buildings and the custody and management of all 35 city property with power to let or sell what may be legally 36 let or sold; to purchase and take in the name of the city, 37 such real or personal property, not exceeding the sum of 38 five hundred thousand dollars, including the property now 39 owned by the town, as they may think useful to the public 40 interest. The fiscal year shall end on the thirty-first day 41 of December in each year. And the city council shall as 42 often as once a year, before the first day of February, cause 43 to be published for the information of the inhabitants, an 44 account of receipts and expenditures and a schedule of the 45 city property for said year, and no money shall be paid 46 from the treasury unless the same be appropriated by the 47 city council, and upon a warrant signed by the mayor, which 48 warrant shall state the appropriations under which the same 49 is drawn. Neither the mayor nor any member of the city 50 council shall be elected or appointed during his official term, 51 to any other office under the city government or as agent 52 of the city for any purpose.'

This section is subject, however, to necessary modification 2 according to section nine of this act.

Sect. 7. Section 11 of said Chapter 413 of the Private 2 and Special Laws of 1850 is hereby amended by striking 3 out the word "District" in the nineteenth line thereof and4 inserting the word 'Superior' in place thereof and by add-5 ing thereto the following:

'And said court shall also have original and exclusive juris-2 diction of all offenses arising within said city now cog-3 nizable by said court, and concurrent jurisdiction with the 4 Municipal Court of the City of Augusta and the Gardiner 5 Municipal Court, of all such offenses arising within the 6 Town of Chelsea'; so that said section as amended shall 7 read as follows:

'Sect. 11. A Police Court shall be and hereby is estab-2 lished, in and for the city, to be denominated the Municipal 3 Court of the city of Hallowell, to consist of one judge who 4 shall be appointed and commissioned in the manner pro-5 vided in the constitution, who shall have concurrent juris-6 diction with justices of the peace, in all matters civil and 7 criminal, under twenty dollars, within the county of Kenne-8 bec, and original and exclusive jurisdiction in all civil ac-9 tions in which both parties interested, or in which the party 10 plaintiff, and the person or persons summoned as trustees II shall be inhabitants of or residents of said city of Hallowell, 12 excepting all actions in which said judge may be interested; 13 and said court shall also have concurrent jurisdiction with 14 justices of the peace and quorum in all cases of forcible 15 entry and detainer, arising in said county, and original and 16 exclusive jurisdiction in all such cases arising in the city, 17 and shall also have original and exclusive jurisdiction of

18 all violations of the by-laws of said city. And any person 19 aggrieved by any judgment awarded by said court may ap-20 peal therefrom to the Superior Court for said county, in 21 like manner as if the same had been awarded by any justice 22 of the peace, or justices of the peace and quorum. And said 23 court shall also have original and exclusive jurisdiction of 24 all offenses arising within said city now cognizable by said 25 court, and concurrent jurisdiction with the Municipal Court 26 of the City of Augusta and the Gardiner Municipal Court, 27 of all such offenses arising within the Town of Chelsea.'

Sect. 8. Section 20 of said Chapter 413 of the Private 2 and Special Laws of 1850 as amended by Chapter 31 of the 3 Private and Special Laws of 1899, is hereby amended by 4 striking out the words, "he shall give notice in one or two 5 of the papers printed in said city of the time and place of 6 regular ward meetings"; so that said section as amended 7 shall read as follows:

'Sect. 20. The city clerk shall be the clerk of the board 2 of aldermen; he shall perform such duties as shall be pre-3 scribed by the board of aldermen; and shall perform all 4 duties, and exercise all the powers by law incumbent upon 5 or vested in, the town clerk of the town of Hallowell; but 6 the place of regular ward meetings, and also the day and 7 hour, when not fixed by law, shall be determined by the 8 board of aldermen. The board of aldermen may, in the 9 absence of the mayor, choose a president pro tempore, who 10 shall preside at meetings of the board. The board shall 11 keep a record of its proceedings, and judge of the election 12 of its own members; and in case of failure of election or 13 vacancy by death, resignation or otherwise, may order new 14 elections. A quorum for the transaction of business, shall 15 consist of a majority of the members thereof; all meetings 16 of the aldermen shall be open and public, and the presiding 17 officer shall have the power of moderators of town meet-18 ings. At any of said meetings, when any two members 19 shall request it, the vote shall be taken by yeas and nays, 20 which shall be recorded by the clerk.'

Sect. 9. This act shall take effect when approved, and all 2 acts and parts of acts inconsistent herewith, and all pro-3 visions of the charter and ordinances of the said city of 4 Hallowell inconsistent with this act are hereby modified 5 so as to conform to the provisions of this act; substituting 6 therein for the words "first Monday in (or of) March" 7 the words 'second Monday of December,' and for the words 8 "second Monday in (or of) March" the words 'first Mon-9 day of January,' and for the words "annual" or "annually" 10 the words 'biennial' or 'biennially,' and for the words "one 11 year" the words 'two years,' and striking out the words 12 "city marshal" and the words "street commissioner," 13 wherever such substitution or striking out is necessary to 14 effect the intent of this act. But this section shall take 15 effect as to the subject matter covered by sections one, two, 16 and three, of this act when and only so far as said first 17 three sections or any of them are finally accepted by the 18 electors of said city of Hallowell, as provided in section 19 four of this act.
