# IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE HUNDRED AND SEVENTEEN

AN ACT to amend Section 24 of Chapter 5 of the Revised Statutes of 1916 relating to the registration of voters.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Section 24 of Chapter 5 of the Revised Statutes of 1916

- 2 is hereby amended by the addition after the word "ward,"
- 3 the last word in the first sentence in said paragraph, of the
- 4 words 'and upon such ballot so challenged, witnessed by
- 5 two election officers representing two different parties,' so
- 6 that said section when amended shall read as follows:

'Sect. 24. Any qualified elector in said cities may chal-

2 lenge the right of any person to vote in any ward of said 3 cities at any election held therein and shall be given the 4 opportunity by the presiding officer thereof, to make such 5 challenge, and such presiding officer shall note the fact of 6 such challenge upon the voting list used in such ward, and 7 upon such ballot so challenged, witnessed by two election 8 officers representing two different parties. But before per-9 mitting a person so challenged to vote the warden shall to cause him to state his place and date of birth; occupation; II place of business; whether married or single; if married, the 12 name and residence of his wife; how long a resident of the 13 city, and where his last vote was cast, which answers shall 14 be reduced to writing on blanks furnished for that purpose 15 by the city clerk, and signed by the voter, whose signature 16 shall be witnessed by two election officers representing two 17 different parties. The warden shall promptly return all such 18 records to the city clerk who shall keep them on file for 19 public inspection for one year. Any failure to comply with 20 the provisions of this section shall be a misdemeanor and 21 be punishable as provided in section twenty-nine of this 22 chapter.'
