STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE HUNDRED AND SEVENTEEN

AN ACT to amend Section 19 of Chapter 5 of the Revised Statutes of 1916 relating to the registration of voters.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows: Section 19 of Chapter 5 of the Revised Statutes of 1916

- 2 is hereby amended by adding after the first sentence thereof,
- 3 'and in cities of not less than 35,000 inhabitants said board
- 4 shall be in session the sixty secular days prior to any State
- 5 or Municipal election; on the first twenty of said days said
- 6 boards shall be in session from nine o'clock in the forenoon
- 7 to one o'clock in the afternoon, and from three o'clock to

8 five o'clock in the afternoon, and on the next ten secular 9 days the said boards shall be in session from nine o'clock in 10 the forenoon to one o'clock in the afternoon and from three II o'clock to five o'clock in the afternoon, and from seven to 12 nine o'clock in the afternoon, to receive evidence and to de-13 termine the qualifications and rights of registration of voters 14 therein, and to revise and correct the voting lists; and on the 15 latter thirty of said sixty secular days said boards shall be 16 in session to enable said boards to verify the correctness of 17 the voting lists and to close up the records of said boards, 18 and to hear and determine the right of any person, whose 19 right has been challenged, to have his name added to or 20 remain on said list or be stricken from the same. In cities 21 of not less than 35,000 inhabitants registration prior to any 22 Presidential election shall be held during the days and hours 23 fixed by this section for the registration of voters for the 24 Municipal election next following,' so that said section when 25 amended shall read as follows:

'Sect. 19. Said boards of registration shall be in session 2 from nine in the forenoon to one o'clock in the afternoon, 3 and from three to five o'clock in the afternoon and from 4 seven to nine o'clock in the afternoon, in cities of not less 5 than nineteen thousand inhabitants, on each of the twelve 6 secular days next prior to any election; on the first nine 7 of said secular days, to receive evidence touching the quali-8 fications of voters therein, and to revise and correct the 9 voting lists, and on the latter three of said secular days, to

10 enable the board to verify the correctness of said lists and II to complete and close up its records of said sessions, and 12 in cities of not less than 35,000 inhabitants said board shall 13 be in session the sixty secular days prior to any State or 14 Municipal election; on the first twenty of said days said 15 boards shall be in session from nine o'clock in the forenoon 16 to one o'clock in the afternoon, and from three o'clock to 17 five o'clock in the afternoon, and on the next ten secular 18 days the said boards shall be in session from nine o'clock 19 in the forenoon to one o'clock in the afternoon and from 20 three o'clock to five o'clock in the afternoon, and from seven 21 to nine o'clock in the afternoon, to receive evidence and to 22 determine the qualifications and rights of registration of 23 voters therein, and to revise and correct the voting lists; and 24 on the latter thirty of said sixty secular days said boards 25 shall be in session to enable said board to verify the cor-26 rectness of the voting lists and to close up the records of 27 said boards, and to hear and determine the right of any 28 person, whose right has been challenged, to have his name 29 added to or remain on said list or be stricken from the 30 same. In cities of not less than 35,000 inhabitants registra-31 tion prior to any Presidential election shall be held during 32 the days and hours fixed by this section for the registration 33 of voters for the municipal election next following. And 34 in all other cities, for the same purpose, and at the same 35 hours on each of the five secular days next prior to any 36 election, the first four thereof to be devoted to registration 37 as above, and the last one of said secular days to enable 38 the board to verify the correctness of said lists and to 39 complete and close up its records of said sessions. And on 40 the last of said secular days, at five o'clock in the afternoon, 41 certified copies of said voting lists shall be delivered to 42 the clerks of said cities and receipts taken therefor, except 43 that on the last of said days devoted to registration and 44 on the last of said days devoted to the records as above, 45 the sessions of the board shall close at five o'clock in the 46 afternoon, but no name shall be added to or stricken from 47 said lists after five o'clock in the afternoon of the last of 48 said days devoted to registration as above. Said board shall 49 not place upon said lists during said revision of the same, 50 the name of any person who shall not personally appear 51 before said board and request it, and during said time said 52 board shall revise and correct the voting lists. Nothing in 53 this chapter shall be so construed as to require any voter, 54 whose name is already upon any ward list and who after-55 wards moves from said ward to any other ward in said 56 city, to appear personally before said board during the re-57 vision of the list in order to transfer his name from one 58 ward list to another. The wardens of cities shall be gov-59 erned by said revised and corrected lists; and no names 60 shall be added to or stricken from said lists on the day of 61 election, and no person shall vote at any election whose 62 name is not on said lists. No board of registration shall 63 be answerable for any omission of a name or residence from 64 the voting lists or for any error in the same, unless such 65 name and residence are correctly entered in the general 66 register of voters; but on the day of election said board 67 shall be in session, and shall give to any registered voter 68 whose name has been omitted from the voting list, or in 69 whose name or residence as placed on said voting list a 70 clerical error has been made, a certificate signed by a 71 majority of the board, giving the corrected name and resi-72 dence of such person, and directed to the officer presiding 73 over the election; such officer shall on receipt of such cer-74 tificate allow the person therein named to vote and shall 75 check his name on the certificate, and securely attach the 76 certificate to the voting list.'
