### STATE OF MAINE

# IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE. HUNDRED AND SEVENTEEN

AN ACT to provide for a physical examination of persons committed to jails.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows: Section I. Every person, male or female, confined in any
county jail shall, within forty-eight hours from the time he
or she shall have been received therein and before he or she
is allowed to mingle with other persons confined in said jail,
be examined by a competent physician, who shall determine
whether or not he or she is afflicted with any infectious or
contagious disease.

Sect. 2. Any person found to be afflicted with any in-2 fectious or contagious disease, shall be kept apart from other 3 persons confined in said jail and shall be so controlled as 4 best to prevent the spreading of such disease.

Sect. 3. The county commissioners in the several counties 2 shall employ one or more competent physicians in their re-3 spective counties to make the examination provided for in 4 this act. Such physicians shall be paid by the county in 5 which such examination is made. They shall receive for 6 such service such compensation as may be agreed upon be-7 tween them and said county commissioners.

Sect. 4. It shall be the duty of the several sheriffs to see 2 that the provisions of Sections 1 and 2 of this act are com-3 plied with in their respective counties.

Sect. 5. Any person failing to perform the duties im-2 posed upon him by the provisions of this act shall be subject 3 to a fine of not less than ten dollars for each offense; said 4 fine to be recovered in the same manner as fines are recov-5 ered in other criminal matters.
