RESOLVE for Aid in the repair of a Highway Bridge over the New Meadows River near the New Meadows Inn, so called, and connecting the town of West Bath, in the County of Sagadahoc, with the town of Brunswick in the County of Cumberland.

---

*Resolved,* That there be and hereby is appropriated for  
2 the year nineteen hundred and seventeen the sum of eight  
3 hundred dollars for the purpose of replanking and other-  
4 wise repairing New Meadows River bridge connecting the  
5 towns of West Bath and Brunswick. Provided that the

6 city of Bath appropriates four hundred dollars for the same  
7 purpose, and the said appropriation to be expended under  
8 the direction of the board of highways and sewers of said  
9 city of Bath.

## STATEMENT OF FACTS.

The town or city of Bath has built and maintained at its own expense bridges over the New Meadows river connecting towns entirely outside its territorial limits for about seventy years.

The present bridge was authorized by an act of the Legislature of 1903, Chapter 304, Page 477 of the Acts and Resolves. It is a wooden trestle bridge and was built by the city of Bath in 1909, at an expense of \$5717.87 by compulsion of the town of Brunswick.

It is now in poor condition and needs to be replanked and otherwise repaired.
