#### STATE OF MAINE

# IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE HUNDRED AND SEVENTEEN

AN ACT to Provide for the Distribution of State School Funds Available for the Support of Common Schools.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:
Section I. In this act the word "town" shall include the
2 cities, towns and plantations in which common schools are
3 established and controlled by the several municipalities; the
4 expression "aggregate attendance" shall be understood to
5 be the sum total of the number of days attendance for any
6 one school year of each regularly enrolled pupil of a com7 mon school; the words "common school fund" shall be

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8 understood to be the sum total of one-half the tax on sav-9 ings banks as provided by law, one-half the tax on trust 10 and banking companies as provided by law, the amount of 11 the interest on permanent school fund at six per cent as 12 provided by law, together with all moneys received by the 13 treasurer of state under sections one hundred fifty-five, one 14 hundred fifty-six, one hundred fifty-nine and one hundred 15 sixty of chapter sixteen of the Revised Statutes.

Sect. 2. 'The common school fund not otherwise appro-2 priated by law shall be distributed by the treasurer of state 3 to the towns on the first day of December nineteen hundred 4 eighteen, and annually thereafter, according to the aggre-5 gate attendance of scholars in each town as the same shall 6 appear from the official returns made to the state superin-7 tendent of public schools for the preceding school year as 8 provided for by section sixty-one of chapter sixteen of the 9 Revised Statutes. Said return shall include such facts in 10 regard to attendance and days when schools are in session 11 as the state superintendent of public schools shall determine 12 and may be required to be attested by the teachers in charge 13 of the schools.

Sect. 3. The aggregate attendance of scholars in a town 2 shall be determined by the state superintendent of public 3 schools by adding the total number of days each pupil was 4 in actual attendance, provided that attendance of each reg-5 ularly enrolled pupil shall be counted for each school holi-6 day, for each day of the school year when there was no ses-

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7 sion of school because of the absence of the teacher in at-8 tendance on teachers' meetings as provided by law, for not 9 more than one day in each term when there was no session 10 of school because of the absence of the teacher in visiting II other schools when so authorized by the superintending 12 school committee, and for each day of the school year, not 13 to exceed a total of fifteen school days in any one school 14 year, when there was no session of school by order of the 15 proper authorities because of the prevalence of an epidemic 16 or because of the unfitness of the schoolbuilding from the 17 effects of fire or other unpreventable cause, provided such 18 loss of sessions is not afterward made up. For all schools 19 lawfully established and maintained there shall be reckoned 20 a minimum of aggregate attendance of fifteen hundred days. 21 The attendance of pupils in union schools established as 22 provided by law shall be credited to the town in which the 23 school is located, and the amounts to be contributed by each 24 town for the maintenance of such school shall be determined 25 by the superintending school committees of the said towns.

Sect. 4. The state superintendent of public schools, with 2 the approval of the governor and council, shall formulate 3 such rules and regulations in regard to recording attendance 4 in schools as may be necessary for the administration of the 5 provisions of this act.

Sect. 5. When in the opinion of the state superintendent 2 of public schools there is cause to investigate any returns 3 made to him as provided by the preceding sections, he shall

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4 report the same to the governor and council with his recom-5 mendations, and with the approval of the governor and coun-6 cil he shall make such investigation as shall determine the 7 true aggregate attendance as provided in this act.

Sect. 6. One-half the amount received by any town from2 the distribution provided herein shall be deemed to be raised3 by such town within the meaning of section sixteen in said4 chapter sixteen of the Revised Statutes.

Sect. 7. This act shall take effect January first, nineteen 2 hundred eighteen. All acts and parts of acts inconsistent 3 with this act are hereby repealed.

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
