STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE HUNDRED AND SEVENTEEN

AN ACT Relating to Marking Lobsters in Transit.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Section 1. All barrels, boxes or other packages in transit

containing lobsters, shall be marked with the word "lobsters" in capital letters, at least one inch in length, together

with the full name of the shipper; said marking shall be

placed in a plain and legible manner on the outside of such

barrels, boxes or other packages; and in case of seizure by

any duly authorized officer, of any barrels, boxes or other

packages in transit, containing lobsters, which are not so

marked, or in case of seizure by such officer, of barrels,

10 boxes or other packages in transit, containing lobsters, less
11 than the prescribed length, such lobsters as are alive and
12 less than the prescribed length, shall be liberated, and all
13 such lobsters as are of the prescribed length found in such
14 barrels, boxes or packages, shall be forfeited and disposed
15 of under the provisions of section forty-seven.

- Sect. 2. Every person, firm, association or corporation 2 who ships lobsters without having the barrels, boxes or 3 other packages in which the same are contained, marked 4 as prescribed in the previous section, shall upon conviction 5 be punished by a fine of twenty-five dollars, and upon sub-6 sequent conviction thereof by a fine of fifty dollars, and 7 any person or corporation in the business of a common 8 carrier of merchandise, who shall knowingly carry or trans-9 port from place to place lobsters in barrels, boxes or other 10 packages not so marked, shall be liable to a penalty of fifty 11 dollars upon each conviction thereof.
 - Sect. 3. Sections 39, 40, 41, 42 and 43 of the Revised 2 Statutes is hereby repealed.
