STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE
HUNDRED AND SEVENTEEN

RESOLVE, granting a state pension to Mrs. Myra G. Millett.

Resolved: That there be paid to Mrs. Myra G. Millett of
2 Portland, widow of Captain Henry Rust Millett of the 1-10-
3 29th Maine Regiment in the Civil War, a state pensioner of
4 eight (\$8.00) dollars per month, payable quarterly from the
5 fund appropriated for military pensions; to begin January 1,
6 1917, and to continue during the pleasure of the legislature,
7 or until otherwise ordered.

STATEMENTS OF FACTS ACCOMPANYING RE-
SOLVE GRANTING STATE PENSION TO
MRS. MYRA G. MILLETT.

Mrs. Myra G. Millett, living at No. 10 Wayland street, Woodfords, Portland, is the widow of Henry R. Millett, who died November 8th, 1914.

Mr. Millett was an invalid for many years.

A special pension was obtained for Mr. Millett through the efforts of Congressman Asher S. Hinds, amounting to twelve (\$12.00) dollars per month. This was not enough to support Mr. Millett and his wife, and they were obliged to sell what little property they had, and when Mr. Millett died, she was penniless.

Mrs. Millett has a son living in Massachusetts, who helps her a little, but his wages are small and he is not able to do much.

Major John M. Gould of the 1-10-29 Maine Regiment Association, of which Mr. Millett was a member, and Judge C. F. Whitman of Norway, are familiar with the case and will vouch for the statements contained herein.

Mrs. Millett is sixty-seven (67) years old.
