STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE
HUNDRED AND SEVENTEEN

AN ACT to change the name of McGurdy or Crowell Pond,
so-called, to Lake Waukesha.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Section 1. That the name of the lake or pond known as
2 McGurdy, and sometimes known as Crowell, the same being
3 situated in the towns of Vienna, Chesterfield and New
4 Sharon, in the county of Franklin, be and the same hereby
5 is, changed from McGurdy to Lake Waukesha.

Sect. 2. All acts or parts of acts inconsistent herewith
2 are hereby repealed.

STATEMENT OF FACTS.

This small lake is situated on the boundary line of the towns of Vienna, Chesterfield and New Sharon, also on the boundary line of Franklin and Kennebec counties. It never had a legal name but is known in that locality as McGurdy and Crowell. It is supposed to have been given these names by parties who may have owned land on its shore. It is proposed to advertise and attract summer visitors to its shore and establish a well conducted summer camp for boys. It has been thought best with the consent of the Legislature to give it the name of Lake Waukesha.
