STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE
HUNDRED AND SEVENTEEN

RESOLVE in favor of the Penobscot Tribe of Indians for
the General Care, Maintenance, Relief and Education
Thereof.

Whereas, the State of Maine holds in trust for the Penobscot Tribe of Indians a certain large sum of money, and whereas all of the funds appropriated by the Seventy-seventh Legislature for the care, maintenance and relief of said tribe have been expended for the purposes and in the manner prescribed by law, and because of the lack of available funds said tribe may fall into distress and be deprived of proper food, shelter and clothing, and

Whereas, by reason of the foregoing facts the appropriation called for by this Resolve is immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health and safety and in the opinion of this Legislature constitutes an emergency as contemplated by the Constitution, be it therefore

Resolved, That there be paid from the state treasury to
2 be expended under the direction of the Governor and Coun-
3 cil by the agent of the Penobscot Tribe of Indians, for the
4 benefit of said tribe for the years nineteen hundred and
5 seventeen and nineteen hundred eighteen as follows:

Interest on Indian Trust Fund five thousand two hundred
2 eighty-five dollars fifty-five cents for the year nineteen hun-
3 dred seventeen and five thousand two hundred eighty-five
4 dollars fifty-five cents for the year nineteen hundred
5 eighteen.

For farming purposes, one thousand dollars for the year
2 nineteen hundred seventeen and one thousand dollars for
3 the year nineteen hundred eighteen.

For bounty on crops, five hundred dollars for the year
2 nineteen hundred seventeen and five hundred dollars for
3 the year nineteen hundred eighteen.

For teachers' salaries, one thousand dollars for the year
2 nineteen hundred seventeen and one thousand dollars for
3 the year nineteen hundred eighteen.

Incidental expenses for schools and public buildings (in-
2 cluding fifty dollars for salary of superintendent of Island
3 schools), seven hundred dollars for the year nineteen hun-

4 dred seventeen and seven hundred dollars for the year nine-
5 teen hundred eighteen.

For medicine and medical attendance, eighteen hundred
2 dollars for the year nineteen hundred and seventeen and
3 eighteen hundred dollars for the year nineteen hundred
4 eighteen.

Annuity or fall dividend, seventeen hundred dollars for
2 year nineteen hundred seventeen and seventeen hundred dol-
3 lars for year nineteen hundred eighteen.

Shore rentals, fifteen per cent of which is to be appro-
2 priated and allowed for municipal purposes including hy-
3 drants, two thousand five hundred thirty-nine dollars for
4 the year nineteen hundred seventeen and two thousand five
5 hundred and thirty-nine dollars for year nineteen hundred
6 eighteen.

Salary Governor of Tribe, one hundred dollars for year
2 nineteen hundred seventeen and one hundred dollars for
3 year nineteen hundred eighteen.

Salary Lieutenant Governor of Tribe, fifty dollars for year
2 nineteen hundred seventeen and fifty dollars for year nine-
3 teen hundred eighteen.

Salary Priest, four hundred dollars for year nineteen hun-
2 dred seventeen and four hundred dollars for year nineteen
3 hundred eighteen.

Salary Constable, three hundred dollars for year nineteen
2 hundred and seventeen and three hundred dollars for year
2 nineteen hundred eighteen.

Salary Superintendent of Farming, fifty dollars for year
2 nineteen hundred seventeen and fifty dollars for year nine-
3 teen hundred eighteen.

Salary Indian Agent, five hundred dollars for year nine-
2 teen hundred seventeen and five hundred for year nineteen
3 hundred eighteen.

Special Poor Fund, twenty-five hundred dollars for year
2 nineteen hundred seventeen and twenty-five hundred dollars
3 for year nineteen hundred eighteen.

Purchase of basket ash for use of Tribe, three hundred
2 fifty dollars for year nineteen hundred seventeen and three
3 hundred fifty dollars for year nineteen hundred eighteen.

Making a total of eighteen thousand seven hundred seven-
2 ty-four dollars fifty-five cents for the year nineteen hun-
3 dred seventeen and eighteen thousand seven hundred
4 seventy-four dollars and fifty-five cents for the year nine-
5 teen hundred eighteen.

The Indian Agent is hereby authorized and instructed to
2 pay out of the interest on Indian Trust Fund for the hauling
3 of seven cords of wood to each family, such families fur-
4 nishing their own wood.
