STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE HUNDRED AND SEVENTEEN

AN ACT amending Section 14 of Chapter 41 of the Revised Statutes in relation to the license fee for Itinerant Vendors.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:
Section 14 of Chapter 41 is hereby amended by striking out
2 the words "twenty-five" in the sixth line and substituting
3 therefor the words 'five hundred' so that said section as
4 amended shall read as follows:

'Sect. 14. Vendors shall make deposit before procuring 2 license; license not transferable; licensee may have assis-3 tants. R. S. C. 45 4. Every itinerant vendor desiring to do

4 business in this state shall deposit with the secretary of state 5 the sum of five hundred dollars as a special deposit, and 6 after such deposit, upon application in proper form and the 7 payment of a further sum of five hundred dollars as a state 8 license fee, the secretary of state shall issue to him an itiner-9 ant vendor's license, authorizing him to do business in the 10 state in conformity with the provisions of this chapter for 11 the term of one year from the date thereof. Every license 12 shall set forth a copy of the application upon which it is 13 granted. Such license shall not be transferable nor give 14 authority to more than one person to sell goods as an 15 itinerant vendor, either by agent or clerk or in any other 16 way than in his own proper person, but any licensee may 17 have the assistance of one or more persons in conducting his 18 business, who may aid that principal but shall not act for 19 or without him. No person shall be entitled to hold, or 20 directly or indirectly receive the benefit of more than one 21 state license at any one time, and any license obtained, held 22 or used in violation of law is void.'
