STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE
HUNDRED AND SEVENTEEN

AN ACT to Provide for Tuition in Normal Schools in Certain
Instances.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Section one hundred forty-three of chapter sixteen of the
2 Revised Statutes of nineteen hundred sixteen is hereby
3 amended by adding after the word "tuition" in said section
4 the words: 'provided, however, that a pupil attending nor-
5 mal school other than that nearest his home by the usually
6 travelled route be required to pay tuition unless relieved by
7 special permit from the State superintendent of schools,' so
8 that said section as amended shall read as follows:

‘Sect. 143. Applicants for admission shall be sixteen years
2 of age if females, and seventeen if males, and shall signify
3 their intention to become teachers and come under obligation
4 to teach in this state for at least one year, and if they re-
5 ceive a diploma, two years after they have graduated; on
6 these conditions they shall be received without charge for
7 tuition; provided, however that a pupil attending a normal
8 school other than that nearest his home by the usually
9 travelled route be required to pay tuition unless relieved by
10 special permit from the State superintendent of schools.’
