IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE HUNDRED AND SEVENTEEN

RESOLVE, in favor of N. J. Hanna for services rendered and for money expended, while performing his regular duties as a Fish Warden for the State of Maine.

Resolved: That the sum of one hundred and ninety-two

- 2 dollars and seventy cents be, and the same hereby is, appro-
- 3 pirated to be paid to N. J. Hanna of Bristol, in payment for
- 4 services rendered to the state of Maine, as a fish warden,
- 5 during the months of May and June A. D., 1916 and for
- 6 money paid out and expended while in the performance of
- 7 his duties as a fish warden.



STATEMENT OF FACTS.

N. J. Hanna was a duly appointed and legally qualified fish warden. During the months of May and June 1916, he continued in the performance of his regular duties as a fish warden and sent to the Commissioner of Sea and Shore Fisheries his weekly and monthly reports. On the 31st day of May he sent to the commissioner his Pay & Expense account for approval. His check did not come but he supposing there was some necessary delay continued his duties through the month of June sending in his weekly and monthly report as usual. On the 30th day of June he sent his Pay & Expense account for approval. He was then notified that he had been laid off and would not be paid.

The Commissioner having resigned without approving the account his only method of collecting what is due him is by an appropriation by the legislature.

His claim is as follows, to wit:
