#### STATE OF MAINE

## IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE HUNDRED AND SEVENTEEN

AN ACT to provide for electric lights on the streets of the Indian village situate on Old Town Indian Island No. 1 in the Reservation of the Penobscot of Tribe of Indians.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Section 1. The Bangor Power Company is hereby author-

- 2 ized to establish and maintain six electric lights, of eighty
- 3 candle power each, at an annual cost not to exceed twenty
- 4 dollars per light, on the streets of the Indian village situate
- 5 on Old Town Indian Island No. 1 in the Reservation of the
- 6 Penobscot Tribe of Indians.
  - Sect. 2. Permission is hereby granted to said Power Com-

- 2 pany to set such poles on said streets, and string wires 3 thereon, as are necessary for the installing and main-4 tenance of said lights. Said poles to be located on said 5 streets at such places as may be designated by the Agent of 6 said tribe.
- Sect. 3. The annual cost for the maintenance of said 2 lights shall be paid for out of the fifteen per cent shore 3 rentals set apart for municipal purposes of said Tribe.
