STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE HUNDRED AND SEVENTEEN

AN ACT to provide a common on Old Town Indian Island No. 1 within the Indian Reservation of the Penobscot Tribe of Indians.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Section 1. Lot numbered 10 situate on Old Town Indian

2 Island No. 1 within the reservation of the Penobscot Tribe

3 of Indians, which said lot numbered 10 is bounded as fol-

- 4 lows: Easterly by the westerly line of Centre street; north-
- 5 erly by the southerly line of lots numbered 15 and 13;
- 6 westerly by the easterly line of lots numbered 12 and 11;
- 7 southerly by a portion of the northerly line of lot numbered

8 8 and the northerly line of lot numbered 7, according to 9 the plan of Indian Old Town Island No. 1 made by J. W. 10 & J. Sewall in June, 1879, the aforesaid lot numbered 10 11 never having been allotted or assigned to any member or 12 members of said tribe, is hereby set apart and designated 13 as a public common for the general use of the members 14 of the aforesaid tribe of Indians.

- Sect. 2. Said common is to be occupied and used by the 2 members of said tribe for all lawful purposes and in the 3 same manner and for such purposes as other commons 4 established and maintained in and by the cities, towns, and 5 municipalities in the state of Maine, are used and occupied.
- Sect. 3. No part or portion of said lot hereby set apart 2 and designated as a common for the public use of said tribe 3 of Indians shall ever be allotted or assigned to any member 4 or members of said tribe of Indians by the agent of the 5 Penobscot tribe of Indians.
