STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE HUNDRED AND SEVENTEEN

AN ACT to create a Municipal Court District within and for the County of Penobscot.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Section 1. The several municipal courts now existing, and 2 any which may hereafter be created, within and for the 3 county of Penobscot, are hereby made and constituted a 4 municipal court district for said county of Penobscot.

Sect. 2. The judges of said courts shall alternate in the 2 holding terms of said courts for civil business only, and 3 while presiding at any stated term of either of said courts

- 4 shall be vested with all the powers and authority conferred 5 upon the several judges by the acts creating said courts.
- Sect. 3. The judges of said courts shall meet at the mu-2 nicipal court room of the Bangor municipal court, in Ban-3 gor, in said county, on the first Monday in January in each 4 year, and there designate the terms of said courts at which 5 the said judges severally shall preside.
- Sect. 4. The judge of the municipal court of Bangor shall 2 preside at said meeting, and shall determine any assignments of the judges as aforesaid not agreed upon by the 4 majority of the said judges present.
- Sect. 5. The first meeting of said judges shall be held on 2 the first Monday in the month following the date when this 3 act shall take effect at which time the designation of the 4 terms and alternation of the judges for the remainder of 5 the year one thousand nine hundred and seventeen shall be 6 made.
- Sect. 6. In addition to the compensation now provided 2 for said judges, they shall be paid from the treasury of 3 said county of Penobscot all actual expenses by them in-4 curred in the discharge of their duties while attending court 5 in any place other than their home town or city, and the 6 treasurer shall pay the same on the warrant of the county 7 commissioners for said county.
