STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE
HUNDRED AND SEVENTEEN

AN ACT to Amend Chapter Two Hundred and Thirteen of the Private and Special Laws of Nineteen Hundred Fifteen, Relative to the Granting of Licenses for Certain Businesses and Purposes by the Municipal Officers of the City of Portland.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Section 1. The municipal officers of the city of Portland
2 are hereby authorized to grant licenses for the following
3 businesses and purposes for such periods of time and in ac-
4 cordance with such rules and regulations not inconsistent
5 with law, and upon payment by the licensee of such fees, as
6 the city council of said city may make and establish by or-
7 dinance, to wit:

Auctioneers, the maintenance and operation of sidewalk
2 tanks and pumps for the sale or distribution of gasoline and
3 other volatile inflammable liquid for fuel or power, billiard
4 tables, pool tables, bowling alleys, junk dealers, peddlers,
5 employment agencies, itinerant vendors, public carriages,
6 automobiles, and taxicabs having no specified routes or
7 termini, and the drivers or operators thereof, public wagons
8 and trucks and drivers or operators thereof, amusements,
9 exhibitions and performances, dealers in explosives, thea-
10 ters, moving picture houses, inn-holders, victualers, pawn
11 brokers, lodging houses (of ten lodging rooms or more)
12 public shooting galleries, dealers in fire works, public dance
13 halls, circuses, organ grinders, motor busses having specified
14 routes or termini, and the drivers or operators thereof, hand-
15 carts or push carts, money lenders, bill distributors, ticket
16 speculators and the maintenance of signs, flags, banners,
17 awnings, marquees, and other temporary or permanent
18 structures, excepting telephone and telegraph poles, over the
19 side walks, roads, ways and streets of said city.

Sect. 2. All acts, parts of acts, ordinances, parts of ordi-
2 nances, and provisions of charters, inconsistent with the
3 provisions hereof, are hereby repealed.
