STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE
HUNDRED AND SEVENTEEN

RESOLVE, in favor of the town of Washburn.

Resolved, that there be and hereby is appropriated the sum
2 of one thousand dollars for the year nineteen hundred and
3 seventeen to be paid to the town of Washburn. This sum
4 being the amount the said town should have received in nine-
5 teen hundred thirteen and nineteen hundred fourteen as
6 state aid for maintenance of a course in agriculture in its
7 high school.

STATEMENT OF FACTS.

The amount of money referred to in the above resolve is for the town of Washburn as a reimbursement for money expended in maintaining a course of agriculture in Washburn High School for the school years ending July 1, 1913, and July 1, 1914, respectively. The same being given under the Public Laws of 1911, Chapter 188.

The reason that the town failed to receive the reimbursement for the first of the above years was because the average attendance in the above course was eleven and a fraction when the laws require twelve.

The reason why the reimbursement was not made for the second year mentioned above was because the "returns" were not received by the State Superintendent of Schools as required by law. The local Superintendent of Schools claims that he made the above returns and that if they were not received at Augusta they were lost in transit. We are duplicating these returns and are seeking a reimbursement for each of the above years.
