STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE HUNDRED AND SEVENTEEN

AN ACT to Amend Section Sixty-eight of Chapter Sixteen of the Revised Statutes Relating to the Election of Truant Officers.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Section sixty-eight of chapter sixteen of the Revised Stat-

- 2 utes is hereby amended by adding to said section the follow-
- 3 ing words: 'The superintending school committee may au-
- 4 thorize the superintendent of schools to act as a truant offi-
- 5 cer and when so authorized he shall have the same powers
- 6 and may perform the same duties as other truant officers

7 elected as provided in this section,' so that said section when 8 amended shall read as follows:

'Sect. 68. The superintending school committee of every 2 city and town shall annually elect one or more persons, to 3 be designated truant officers, who shall inquire into all cases 4 of neglect of the duties prescribed in section sixty-six and 5 ascertain the reasons therefor and shall promptly report the 6 same to the superintending school committee, and such tru-7 ant officers or any of them, shall, when so directed by the 8 school committee or superintendent, in writing, prosecute 9 in the name of the state any person neglecting to perform to the duties prescribed in said section, by promptly entering 11 a complaint before a magistrate; and said officer shall, when 12 notified by any teacher that any pupil is irregular in attend-13 ance, arrest and take such pupil to school when found tru-14 ant; and further such officers shall enforce the provisions 15 of sections one hundred forty-nine to one hundred fifty-16 one, inclusive, of this chapter. Truant officers, when so 17 directed in writing by the superintendent of schools or the 18 superintending school committee of their respective towns 19 may visit the manufacturing, mechanical, mercantile and 20 other business establishments in their several cities and 21 towns during the hours in which the public schools of such 22 city or town or in session, and ascertain whether any minors 23 under the age of fourteen years are employed therein, and 24 shall report in writing any cases of such employment to the 25 superintendent of schools or the superintending school com-

26 mittee of their city or town; and if any minors are employed 27 therein contrary to the provisions of chapter forty-nine, they 28 shall also report in writing such illegal employment to the 29 commissioner of labor and industry. The owner, superin-30 tendent, overseer or agent of all manufacturing, mechani-31 cal, mercantile or other business establishments, upon re-32 quest shall produce for the inspection of such truant officers 33 all work permits and vacation permits required to be kept 34 on file in such establishments under chapter forty-nine. 35 Superintending school committees shall elect truant officers 36 at their first meeting after the annual meeting of the town; 37 they shall fill any vacancies occurring during the year and 38 they may fix the compensation of said officers and said com-39 pensation shall be paid from the appropriation made for the 40 salaries of municipal officers. Any truant officer neglect-41 ing any duty required of him under the provisions of this 42 chapter shall be liable to a fine of not less than ten, nor 43 more than fifty dollars; and any town failing through its 44 superintending school committee to meet said provisions 45 shall be liable to the provisions of section nineteen of this 46 chapter. The superintending school committee may author-47 ize the superintendent of schools to act as a truant officer 48 and when so authorized he shall have the same powers and 49 may perform the same duties as other truant officers elected 50 as provided in this section.'
