STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE HUNDRED AND SEVENTEEN

AN ACT to Amend Section Thirty-Four of Chapter Fifty-Five of the Revised Statutes, Relating to Public Utilities and Free Transportation on same.

Be it enacted by the Pcople of the State of Maine, as follows:
Section thirty-four of chapter fifty-five of the revised stat2 utes of nineteen hundred and sixteen is hereby amended by
3 inserting after the word "apparatus" in the twelfth line
4 thereof, the words: 'call men of fire departments wearing
5 badges, while going to or returning from fires, chiefs, cap6 tains, sergeants, lieutenants and inspectors of police depart7 ments in plain clothes and wearing badges,' so that the same
8 as amended, shall read as follows:

'Sect. 34. It shall be unlawful for any person, firm or cor-2 poration knowingly to solicit, accept or receive any rebate, 3 discount or discrimination in respect to any service rendered, 4 or to be rendered by any public utility, or for any service in 5 connection therewith whereby any such service shall in any 6 manner, or by any device whatsoever, be rendered free or at 7 a rate less than named in the schedules in force as provided 8 herein or whereby any service or advantage is received other 9 than is herein specified; provided that this chapter shall 10 not prohibit such free or reduced rates by public utilities as is II defined and provided for in the acts of Congress entitled, 12 "An Act to Regulate Commerce" and acts amendatory 13 thereof, nor free or reduced transportation to the officers of 14 leased lines or to police officers or firemen in uniform or of 15 municipal fire apparatus, call men of fire departments wear-16 ing badges while going to or returning from fires, chiefs, 17 captains, sergeants, lieutenants and inspectors of police de-18 partments, in plain clothes and wearing badges, editors and 19 regular reporters of newspapers, nor free transportation un-20 der the provision of section fifty-one of chapter fifty-six; 21 nor shall it be construed to prohibit any public utility from 22 granting service at free or reduced rates for charitable or 23 benevolent purposes, provided the same be approved by the 24 commission; nor shall it be unlawful for any public utility to 25 make special rates to its employees or in cases of emergency 26 service, nor shall the furnishing by any public utility of any 27 product or service at the rates and upon terms and conditions 28 provided for in any contract in existence January first, nine-29 teen hundred thirteen be construed as constituting a dis-30 crimination or undue or unreasonable preference, or advant-31 age within the meaning specified; provided, however, that .32 when any such contract or contracts are or become termin-33 able by notice of such utility the commission shall have 34 power in its discretion to direct by order that such contract 35 or contracts shall be terminated by such utility as and when 36 directed by such order; and provided, further, that it shall be 37 lawful for any public utility to make a contract for a definite 38 term subject to the approval of the commission, for its 39 product or service, but such published rates shall not be 40 changed during the term of the contract without the con-41 sent of the commission. Any person, firm or corporation 42 violating the provisions of this section shall be published by a 43 fine of not more than one thousand dollars for each .44 offense.'
