STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE HUNDRED AND SEVENTEEN

AN ACT to regulate the practice of the system, method or science of healing known as osteopathy, creating a board of examination and registration for those desiring to practice the same and providing penalties for violation of this act.

Be it cnacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Section 1. Within thirty days after this act shall take ef-

2 fect, the governor, by and with the advice and consent of 3 the council, shall appoint five persons who shall constitute

- 4 a board of registration of osteopathy. Said persons shall
- 5 be residents of this state, shall be graduates of a legally
- 6 chartered osteopathic college or university having the pow-
- 7 er to confer degrees in osteopathy, shall have been at the

8 time of their appointment actively engaged in the practice 9 of their profession for a period of at least three years. One 10 of said persons appointed as aforesaid shall be designated to II hold office for five years, one for four years, one for three 12 years, one for two years and one for one year. At the ex-13 piration of the term of service thus designated each appoint-14 ment thereafter shall be for the period of five years. Any 15 vacancy in said board caused by death, resignation or for 16 any other cause except completion of a full term of service 17 shall be filled by the appointment of a person qualified as 18 aforesaid to hold office during the unexpired term of the 19 member whose place he fills. The person designated to hold 20 office for one year shall be deemed chairman of the board 21 for the purpose of designating the time and place for hold-22 ing the first meeting of the board for the purpose of or-23 ganization.

Sect. 2. Said board shall meet on the first Tuesday of 2 September of each year at such time and place as its chair-3 man may designate for the purpose of organization. They 4 shall elect one of their members as chairman for a term 5 of one year, and one of their members as secretary and 6 treasurer, to hold such office at the pleasure of the board; 7 provided, however, that the first meeting for organization 8 under the provisions of this act shall be within fourteen 9 days after the appointment and confirmation of said board, 10 and the officers elected at the first meeting shall continue 11 as such until the annual meeting of the board in the year

12 1918. The person elected as secretary and treasurer shall 13 give a bond to the treasurer of state in the penal sum of 14 one thousand dollars with sureties to be approved by the 15 governor and council for the faithful discharge of the du-16 ties of his office. Said board shall hold regular meetings 17 at least twice in each year for the purpose of considering 18 applications, examining applicants and such other business 19 as may properly come before the board, the time and place 20 of such meetings to be determined by the board. Special 21 meetings may be called at the pleasure of the president, and 22 in case of the death or inability of the president, the secre-23 tary may call special meetings. Said board shall cause a 24 seal of suitable inscription to be procured and to be affixed 25 to such papers as may require such seal, shall keep a cor-26 rect record of all its proceedings, and shall have power to 27 make such rules and regulations, not inconsistent with law, 28 as it may deem necessary for the successful enforcement 29 of its authority and the performance of its duties. 30 president and secretary shall be empowered to administer 31 oaths in matters connected with the duties of said board. 32 The boards of said board shall include among other things a 33 list of all applicants for certificates, giving the name and lo-34 cation of the institution granting a degree of doctor of osteo-35 pathy to the applicant, and the fact shall be recorded whether 36 the applicant was granted or denied a certificate. Such rec-37 ord shall be a public record and shall be prima facie evi-38 dence of all matters recorded therein. Three members of the

39 board shall constitute a quorum for the transaction of bus-40 iness but no certificate to practice osteopathy shall be grant-41 ed except on an affirmative vote of at least three members 42 of the board.

Sect. 3. Each applicant for a certificate to practice oste-2 opathy, when making application, shall deposit with the sec-3 retary of the board a fee of twenty dollars, which shall be 4 returned to the applicant if the application is rejected. Each 5 applicant must be at least twenty-one years of age, may be 6 of either sex, and shall present a diploma from a high school, 7 academy, state normal school, college or university, or oth-8 erwise satisfy the members of the board of sufficient prior 9 academic education. The applicant shall also present a di-10 ploma granted by a legally chartered osteopathic college or II university in good standing and having the power to con-12 fer degrees in osteopathy, which diploma shall show that 13 it was granted on personal attendance of the applicant and 14 completion of a course of not less than eight months in a 15 year for four separate years. The applicant must also pre-16 sent a certificate of good moral character signed by some 17 reputable resident of the State of Maine. The applicant 18 shall also present such other reasonable and proper facts 19 as the board in its blank application may require.

Sect. 4. The board shall then require the applicant to sub-2 mit to an examination as to his or her other qualifications 3 for the practice of osteopathy which shall include, among 4 other subjects, the subjects of anatomy, physiology, chem-

5 istry, bacteriology, toxicology, pathology, dietetics, diagno-6 sis, hygiene, obstetrics and gynecology, principles and prac-7 tice of osteopathy. If such examination is passed in a man-8 ner satisfactory to the board, then the board shall issue to 9 the said applicant a certificate granting him or her the right 10 to practice osteopathy in the State of Maine; provided, that 11 any person having a diploma from a legally chartered os-12 teopathic college or university having the power to confer 13 degrees in osteopathy which was in good standing at the 14 time of issuing such diploma and who has been in active 15 practice in the State of Maine for three months prior to 16 July 1, 1917, may, upon the payment to the secretary of a 17 fee of ten dollars, be granted a certificate by the board to 18 practice osteopathy in this state, without examination, if 19 application for such certificate is filed within ninety days 20 after this act becomes effective. Provided also that any 21 person who has been a practitioner of osteopathy in this 22 state for a period of three years next prior to January I, 23 1917, shall upon exhibition of satisfactory proof thereof to 24 said board and upon the payment of a fee of ten dollars, be 25 entitled to registration if the application for such registra-26 tion is filed within ninety days after this act becomes ef-27 fective. The board may refuse to grant a certificate to any 28 person convicted of a felony, or of gross unprofessional 29 conduct, or who is addicted to any vice to such degree as 30 to render such person unfit to practice osteopathy, and may, 31 after due notice and hearing, revoke a certificate already 32 issued, for like cause.

Sect. 5. When the board shall have granted to a person 2 the certificate mentioned in section 4 of this act such cer-3 tificate shall be publicly displayed at the person's principal 4 place of business so long as the said person shall continue 5 to practice osteopathy for gain or hire, shall entitle the per-6 son to whom granted the right to practice osteopathy in any 7 county in this state, and shall confer upon such person all 8 the rights and duties conferred by law upon medical prac-9 titioners, except the right to administer medicine internal-10 ly, perform surgery and practice obstetrics. But such cer-II tificate shall not entitle the person receiving it to prefix the 12 title "Doctor" or the letters "Dr.," or append the letters 13 "M. D." to his name, or use the title of doctor or physician 14 in any way, excepting that he may prefix the title "Doctor" 15 or the letters "Dr." to his name when accompanied by the 16 word "Osteopathy." And provided further that nothing in 17 this act shall be construed to discriminate against any par-18 ticular school of medicine or surgery or any system or mode 19 of treating the sick or afflicted.

Sect. 6. Any person who shall practice, or pretend or at2 tempt to practice, or use the science or system of osteopathy
3 in treating diseases of the human body by fraud or mis4 representation; or any person who shall buy, sell or fraudu5 lently obtain any diploma, license, record, or registration
6 to practice osteopathy illegally obtained, or signed or is7 sued unlawfully under fraudulent representations; or who
8 shall use any of the forms or letters, "Osteopathy," "Os-

9 teopath," "Osteopathist," "D. O.," "D. Sc. O.," "Osteo10 pathic Physician," "Doctor of Osteopathy," or any other
11 title or letters, either alone or with other qualifying words
12 or phrases, under such circumstances as to induce the be13 lief that the person who uses such term or terms is engaged
14 in the practice of osteopathy, without having complied with
15 the provisions of this act, shall be deemed guilty of a mis16 demeanor, and, upon conviction thereof, shall be fined not
17 less than twenty-five dollars, nor more than one hundred
18 dollars, for each offense, or not less than three months, nor
19 more than six months in the county jail.

Sect. 7. All fees received by the secretary and not re-2 turned to the applicant shall be paid monthly to the state 3 treasurer. The compensation of members of the board shall 4 be five dollars per day for each day actually spent in the 5 discharge of their duty and in addition thereto they shall 6 receive necessary traveling expenses. The secretary shall 7 be allowed extra compensation for books, stationery, post-8 age and other necessary expenses authorized by the board 9 and actually incurred. The compensation and expense of 10 said board and its secretary and all other expenses proper 11 and necessary in the opinion of said board to discharge its 12 duties hereunder and to enforce the provisions of this act 13 shall be paid out of said fund upon the warrant of the state 14 auditor issued upon a requisition signed by the president 15 and secretary of said board, provided, that the amounts so 16 paid shall in no case exceed the total amount received for 17 the current year by the treasurer of state from the board 18 as fees, and so much of said receipts as may be necessary 19 is hereby appropriated for the compensation and expenses 20 of the board as aforesaid.

Sect. 8. The board, its members or agents shall investi2 gate all complaints, and all cases of non-compliance with
3 or violation of the provisions of this chapter relating to the
4 registration of osteopathic physicians and shall bring all
5 such cases to the notice of the proper prosecuting officer.
6 Said board, after a conviction before a proper court for
7 crime in the course of professional business, of any person
8 to whom a certificate has been issued by them, and after
9 hearing, may by vote of four-fifths of the entire board re10 voke the certificate and cancel the registration of the per11 son to whom the same was issued. Said board may also
12 suspend or revoke any certificate by a four-fifths vote of
13 the entire board, in any case where such certificate has been
14 wrongfully obtained or for any fraud connected with the
15 said registration.

Sect. 9. Said board shall annually on or before the first 2 day of January in each year, make a report to the governor 3 containing a full and complete account of all its official acts 4 during the preceding year, also a statement of its receipts 5 and disbursements and such comments or suggestions as it 6 may deem essential.

Sect. 10. Osteopathic physicians shall observe and be sub-2 ject to all state and municipal regulations relating to the

- 3 control of contagious diseases; the reporting and certifying
- 4 of births and deaths; and all matters pertaining to public
- 5 health, the same as physicians of schools of medicine.
- Sect. 11. This act shall not apply to an osteopathic phy-
- 2 sician who is called from another state to treat a particular
- 3 case and does not otherwise practice in this state, nor to pro-
- 4 hibit gratuitous service or the rendering of assistance in
- 5 emergency cases; nor to clairvoyants or persons practicing
- 6 hypnotism, magnetic healing, mind cure, massage, Chris-
- 7 tian Science, or any other method of healing; provided such
- 8 clairvoyants and other persons do not violate any of the
- 9 provisions of the preceding section in relation to the use
- 10 of the word "Doctor," or the letters, "Dr." when used in
- 11 connection with the words or letters "Osteopathy," "Oste-
- 12 opath," "Osteopathist," "D. O.," "D. Sc. O.," "Osteopathic
- 13 Physician," "Doctor of Osteopathy."
 - Sect. 12. All acts and parts of acts conflicting with the
 - 2 provisions of this act are repealed in so far as they are in-
 - 3 consistent herewith.
