STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE
HUNDRED AND SEVENTEEN

AN ACT to incorporate the Old Folks' Home in Bath.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Section 1. Thomas G. Plant, James O. Lincoln, Frank H.
2 Percy, Walter S. Glidden, Frank B. Nichols, J. Edward
3 Drake, Edward B. Smith, their associates and successors,
4 are hereby incorporated by the name of the Old Folks'
5 Home, in Bath, for the purpose of providing a suitable and
6 comfortable home for aged persons of both sexes, who may
7 be in need of such home.

Sect. 2. Under the above name, said corporation may sue
2 and be sued, take by purchase, gift, devise, bequest or other-

3 wise, real and personal property, and hold the same for the
4 purpose expressed in section one to an amount not exceeding
5 four hundred thousand dollars; and may control, manage,
6 sell and dispose of the same for the purpose aforesaid; and
7 shall possess all the rights, privileges and immunities, and be
8 subject to all the duties and liabilities that pertain and
9 belong to corporations created for charitable purposes under
10 the laws of this state.

Sect. 3. Said corporation shall elect a board of trustees,
2 not less than seven in number, and may elect such other
3 officers as they may deem proper; may appoint a board of
4 management, and executive committee, and such other
5 officers and committees as they may deem proper, for the
6 control and conduct of any home established under this act;
7 prescribe rules and regulations for the admission and dis-
8 charge of persons, as inmates of said home; adopt all
9 necessary rules and by-laws, and do all other acts necessary
10 or expedient for the establishment and management of said
11 home, not inconsistent with the laws of this state or of the
12 United States.

Sect. 4. The first meeting of the corporation for the pur-
2 pose of organization may be called by any one of the above
3 named corporators by publication of a notice of the time and
4 place of such meeting, signed by such corporator, in any
5 newspaper printed and published in Bath. Such notice must
6 be published at least seven days prior to such meeting and
7 such meeting and all subsequent meetings of said corpor-
8 ation, must be held at Bath.
