STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE HUNDRED AND SEVENTEEN

AN ACT to amend Section twenty-six of Chapter thirty-three of the Revised Statutes (1916) relating to the taking of smelts, minnows, white fish and cusk.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Section 1. Section 26 of Chapter 33 of the Revised 2 Statutes of 1916 is hereby amended by striking out all of

- 3 said section and by substituting therefor the following
- 4 section:

'Sect. 26. It shall be lawful, however, to take smelts in all 2 the inland waters of the state above tidewaters with a dip-

3 net in the usual and ordinary way, and to catch them through 4 the ice in the day time with single hook and line at any time 5 in waters open to ice fishing, but they shall not be taken for 6 sale or sold at any time except for bait for fishing in this 7 state; provided, however, that it shall be lawful to take 8 smelts at any time for sale, within the state only, in any of 9 the tribtuaries to Sebago Lake, with a dip-net in the usual 10 and ordinary way, and in Sebago Lake, with single hook and II line, during January, February and March of each year; 12 provided, further, that it shall be unlawful to take smelts at 13 any time with a dip-net in Swan Lake, in the county of 14 Waldo, or in any of the tributaries to said lake; provided, 15 further, that it shall be lawful to take minnows and other 16 fish usually used for bait in fishing and to sell the same for 17 bait for fishing only in this state; and provided, further, that 18 it shall be lawful to catch white fish and cusk in open water 19 with single hook and line at any time, and with five set lines 20 when fishing through the ice; and provided, further, that it 21 shall be lawful to take suckers with spears during April and 22 May of each year. Whoever violates any provision of this 23 section shall pay a fine of thirty dollars and costs for each 24 offense.'
