AN ACT to amend Paragraph four of Section nineteen of Chapter thirty-three of the Revised Statutes (1916) relating to fishing in certain waters in Cumberland County.

---

*Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:*

Section 1. Paragraph four of Section nineteen of Chapter 2 thirty-three of the Revised Statutes (1916) is hereby 3 amended by striking out all of said paragraph and substitut- 4 ing therefor the following:

Cumberland County.—In North Branch Brook or in any 2 of its tributaries; or in Island Pond or in any of its tribu-

3 taries, said waters being situated partly in Harrison, in  
4 Cumberland County, and partly in Waterford, in Oxford  
5 County; or in Otter Pond, in Bridgton, until July third, nine-  
6 teen hundred twenty; or in any of the tributaries to Sebago  
7 Lake except in Songo River, above Songo Lock, it shall be  
8 lawful to fish in accordance with the general law of the state;  
9 and provided, further, that in Crooked River, from the time  
10 the ice is out of said river in the spring until and including  
11 the thirtieth day of September following, it shall be lawful to  
12 fish with artificial flies, (but not with any spinning, revolving  
13 or minnow-like baits,) in the usual manner of fly casting;  
14 and provided, further, that it shall be unlawful to take, catch  
15 and kill any salmon less than fifteen inches in length or any  
16 trout less than eight inches in length in said Crooked River  
17 at any time and no person shall take, catch and kill more than  
18 two land-locked salmon and two trout in said river in any one  
19 day.'
