STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE
HUNDRED AND SEVENTEEN

AN ACT to amend Section 21 of Chapter 83 of the Revised Statutes of Maine, relating to the authority of County Commissioners to procure temporary loans.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Section 21 of Chapter 83 of the Revised Statutes is hereby
2 amended by adding to said section the following: 'The coun-
3 ty commissioners of each and every other county may under
4 the same conditions make temporary loans not exceeding
5 one-tenth of one per cent of the assessed valuation of their
6 respective counties,' so that said section, as amended, shall
7 read as follows:

'Sect. 21. The county commissioners of Cumberland and
2 Kennebec counties may, without obtaining the consent of
3 their respective counties, raise, by temporary loans to be
4 paid within one year from the time when the same is con-
5 tracted, sums not exceeding seventy-five thousand dollars
6 and fifty thousand dollars respectively, in any year for use
7 of their respective counties, and cause notes or obligations
8 of their respective counties with coupons for lawful interest
9 to be issued for payment thereof as aforesaid. The county
10 commissioners of each and every other county may under
11 the same conditions make temporary loans not exceeding
12 one-tenth of one per cent of the assessed valuation of their
13 respective counties.'
