STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE
HUNDRED AND SEVENTEEN

AN ACT to amend Chapter one hundred ninety-five of the Private and Special Laws of nineteen hundred and thirteen entitled "An Act to authorize the Bangor Railway and Electric Company to take water from Chemo Lake and its tributaries."

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Section one of chapter one hundred ninety-five of the
2 Private and Special Laws of nineteen hundred thirteen is
3 hereby amended by striking out at the end of said section
4 the words "and such contracts have been ratified by the

5 voters thereof at legal meetings of said cities and towns,"
6 so that said section as amended shall read as follows:

'Section 1. The Bangor Railway and Electric Company,
2 a corporation organized under the general laws of the State
3 of Maine, and having its principal place of business in
4 Bangor, in the county of Penobscot, is hereby authorized
5 and empowered to take, divert and use the water from
6 Chemo lake, situated in the towns of Bradley, Clifton and
7 Eddington, in the county of Penobscot, and from its tribu-
8 taries wherever situated, for the sole purpose of supplying
9 the inhabitants of the cities of Old Town and Brewer and
10 the towns of Milford, Veazie and Orrington with pure
11 water; provided, however, that the authority herein granted
12 shall not be exercised until contracts have been entered
13 into between said cities and towns and said Bangor Rail-
14 way and Electric Company, or its successors, in which it is
15 stipulated that Chemo Lake and its tributaries may be used
16 as a source of water supply for said cities and towns and
17 the inhabitants thereof.'
