STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE HUNDRED AND SEVENTEEN

A ACT to amend Sections 20 and 21, Chapter 8 of the Revised Statutes, relating to lands reserved for public use.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:
Section 1. Section 20 of Chapter 8 of the Revised Stat2 utes is hereby amended by striking out in the third and
3 fourth lines thereof the words "the treasury of the county
4 in which the township is situated or into" and by striking
5 out in the fourth and fifth lines thereof the words "of
6 which the income only shall be expended and applied as is
7 by law provided" and inserting after the word "purposes,"

8 in the fourth line thereof the words 'but no interest shall 9 be allowed or paid thereon until the inhabitants of such 10 township or tract are incorporated into a town or organized 11 as a plantation and establish in such plantation one or 12 more schools' so that said section as amended shall read 13 as follows:

'Sect. 20. The money arising from the sale of timber and 2 grass or from trespasses on reserved lands, paid into the 3 state treasury constitutes funds for school purposes, but 4 no interest shall be allowed or paid thereon until the in-5 habitants of such township or tract are incorporated into 6 a town or organized as a plantation and establish in such 7 plantation one or more schools.'

Sect. 2. Section 21 of said Chapter 8 of the Revised 2 Statutes is hereby amended by striking out in the first, 3 second, third, fourth, fifth, sixth and seventh lines thereof 4 the words "The interest shall be added to the principal 5 of such fund, until the inhabitants of such township or 6 tract are incorporated into a town or organized as a plan-7 tation, and establish in such plantation one or more schools, 8 and until the first day of January next preceding the date 9 upon which the treasurer of said plantation shall call for 10 such interest, unless previously expended according to law" 11 and by striking out in the twelfth line thereof the words 12 "the interest of said fund shall be paid" and inserting 13 in place thereof after the word "plantation" in the twelfth 14 line of said section the words 'interest at the rate of six 15 per cent upon said fund belonging to it shall be thereafter 16 allowed and paid' so that said section as amended shall 17 read as follows:

'Sect. 21. When any such township is incorporated as a 2 town, said funds belonging to it shall be paid by the 3 treasurer of state to the treasurer of the trustees of the 4 ministerial and school funds therein, to be added to the 5 funds of that corporation, and held and managed as other 6 school funds of that town are required to be held and 7 managed. If such township or tract is organized as a 8 plantation, interest at the rate of six per cent upon said 9 fund belonging to it shall be thereafter allowed and paid 10 annually by the treasurer of state to the treasurer of such II plantation to be applied toward the support of schools 12 according to the number of scholars in each school. Said 13 interest shall be cast up to the first day of each January, 14 by the treasurer of state. The state superintendent of 15 public schools shall file a list of such plantations with the 16 amount due for interest for the preceding year according 17 to a record of such amounts to be furnished to him by the 18 treasurer of state, in the office of the state auditor, who 19 shall thereupon insert the name and amount due such plan-20 tations in the first warrant drawn in that year. The state 21 superintendent of public schools shall be satisfied that all 22 such plantations are organized, and that schools have been 23 established therein according to law, that assessors are 24 sworn and qualified, and that the treasurers of such plan-25 tations have given bonds as required by law.
