## STATE OF MAINE

# IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE HUNDRED AND SEVENTEEN

AN ACT to amend Chapter 35, Sections 3 and 9 of the Revised Statutes of 1916, relating to the prevention of contagious diseases among animals.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Section 1. Chapter 35, Section 3 of the Revised Statutes

- 2 of 1916 is hereby amended by striking out in the fourteenth
- 3 line thereof, the word "their" and inserting in place there-
- 4 for, the words 'one-half their appraised' so that said section
- 5 as amended shall read as follows:

'Upon the discovery of any disease mentioned in the pre-

2 ceding section, the live stock sanitary commissioner shall 3 give notice of the existence and the locality thereof, by pub-4 lication in such newspapers as he may select, and shall notify 5 in writing the officials or agents of any railroad, steamboat 6 or other transportation company, doing business in or 7 through such infected locality, of the existence of such dis-S ease; he shall establish and maintain such quarantine of ani-9 mals, places, premises or localities, as he may deem neces-10 sary to prevent the spread of any such disease; he shall II cause the animal or animals affected with the said disease, 12 to be appraised in accordance with the rules and regulations 13 made by him, as hereinafter authorized and provided, and 14 shall cause the same to be destroyed, and a proper disposi-15 tion of the carcass made, according to the rules and regula-16 tions aforesaid; he shall pay to the owner or owners thereof 17 one-half their appraised value, as determined at the time of 18 the appraisal, out of any moneys appropriated by the Leg-19 islature for that purpose; provided, however, that no ap-20 praised value shall be more than one hundred dollars for 21 cattle, with a pedigree recorded, or recordable in the recog-22 nized herd books of the breed in which the cattle destroyed 23 may belong, nor more than seventy-five dollars, for the cat-24 tle which have no recordable pedigree; and all other animals 25 so destroyed shall be paid for at the rate of one-half their 26 cash value; provided, that no appraised value shall exceed 27 one hundred dollars for any horse condemned; provided, 28 further, that in no case shall compensation be allowed for

any animal destroyed under the provisions of this chapter which may have contracted or been exposed to such disare ease in a foreign country or on the high seas, or that may have been brought into this State, within one year previous to such animal showing evidence of such disease, and the owner or owners thereof shall furnish satisfactory evidence as to the time during which such animal or animals shall have been owned in the State; nor shall compensation be allowed to any owner who in person, or by agent, knowingly and wilfully conceals the existence of such disease, or the son making such concealment, by himself or agent, is in whole or in part owner.'

Sect. 2. Chapter 35, Section 9, is amended by striking out 2 all of said section down to and including the word animal 3 in line twenty-four, so that said section as amended shall 4 read as follows:

'Sect. 9. Cattle reacting to the tuberculin test may be 2 sent to establishments maintaining a U. S. Government meat 3 inspection service, and be killed under Federal government 4 inspection, and be disposed of according to the requirements 5 of the Government Meat Inspection Act.'
