STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE
HUNDRED AND SEVENTEEN

AN ACT to Accept the Benefits of An Act Passed by the Senate and House of Representatives of the United States of America in Congress Assembled to Provide for the Promotion of Vocational Education.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Section 1. That the State of Maine does hereby accept the
2 benefits of an act passed by the Senate and House of Repre-
3 sentatives of the United States of America in Congress
4 assembled entitled "An act to provide for the promotion of
5 vocational education; to provide for cooperation with the

6 states in the promotion of such education in agriculture and
7 the trades and industries; to provide for cooperation with the
8 states in the preparation of teachers of vocational subjects;
9 and to appropriate money and regulate its expenditure," ap-
10 proved February 23, 1917, and will observe and comply with
11 all the requirements of said act.

Sect. 2. That a State Board is hereby created for the pur-
2 poses of the said act, and is hereby given all necessary power
3 to cooperate with the Federal Board of Vocational Educa-
4 tion in the administration of the provisions of the act. Said
5 board shall consist of three members of whom the state su-
6 perintendent of public schools shall serve as chairman and
7 the other two members shall be appointed by the governor
8 with the advice and consent of the council for terms of
9 three years. The said board shall serve without compensa-
10 tion.

Sect. 3. The treasurer of state is hereby designated as
2 custodian for all appropriations received by the state under
3 the provisions of the act and he shall receive and provide for
4 the proper custody and distribution of all money paid to the
5 state from said appropriations.
