STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOSAND NINE
HUNDRED AND SEVENTEEN

AN ACT to amend section one hundred forty-three of chapter sixteen of the revised statutes relating to the admission of students to state normal schools.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Section one hundred forty-three of chapter sixteen of the
2 revised statutes is hereby amended by striking out the words
3 "two years" in the fourth line thereof and inserting in place
4 thereof the words 'the first two years of teaching,' and by
5 adding to said section the words 'otherwise they shall pay

6 tuition at the rate of fifty dollars per year,' so that said sec-
7 tion when amended shall read as follows:

'Sect. 143. Applicants for admission shall be sixteen years
2 of age if females, and seventeen if males, and shall signify
3 their intention to become teachers and come under obliga-
4 tion to teach in this state for at least one year, and if they
5 receive a diploma, the first two years of teaching after they
6 have graduated; on these conditions they shall be received
7 without charge for tuition, otherwise they shall pay tuition
8 at the rate of fifty dollars per year.'
